- ✓Easier to cut and install

Considerations

- Slightly less durable than porcelain
 - Not always ideal for heavy-use floors
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Natural Stone

Examples include:

- Marble
- Slate
- Travertine
- Granite

Advantages

- ✓Adds character and value

Considerations

- Higher initial investment
- Requires periodic sealing

- More maintenance than porcelain
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Glass Tile

Ideal for:

- Accent walls
- Decorative borders
- Shower niches
- Mosaic features

Advantages

- ✓Brightens the room
- ✓Reflects natural light
- ✓Beautiful decorative accents

Considerations

- Generally not used as primary floor tile
 - Installation may require additional care

- Excellent slip resistance
 - Flexible design options
 - Great for curved surfaces
