A Journey

Join your sisters and brothers in Christ at St. Petri Lutheran on a journey through Lent and Holy Week, a journey leading to new life, life eternal, in Jesus Christ and culminating in the joyous celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord; Easter. Please read the details of our extra worship services opportunities and plan how to utilize them to enrich your spiritual journey this year.

Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18th and ends forty days later (not counting Sundays). Midweek Lenten worship services will be held at 6:30pm each Wednesday through March 25th. There will be no Wednesday service during Holy Week (April 1st).

Ash Wednesday

Lent begins with a solemn call to fasting and repentance as we begin our journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Now is the acceptable time to return to the Lord. During Lent we will reflect on the meaning of our

baptism into Christ's death and resurrection. The sign of ashes suggests our human mortality and frailty. What seems like an ending is really an invitation to make each day a new beginning, in which we are washed in God's mercy and forgiveness. With the cross on our brow, we long for the spiritual renewal that flows from the springtime Easter feast to come. (Adapted from *Sundays and Seasons*)

At the Name of Jesus: A Midweek Lenten Series

Our midweek services will be based on the second reading for Passion Sunday, Philippians 2:5-11. This series will help us have a deeper and richer celebration of the passion of Christ on the first day of Holy Week and exploit the rich contrast between that Sunday's entrance rite shouts of "Hosanna!" over and against the passion reading's cries of "Crucify!" Both ends of the theological and emotional spectrum are significant touchstones for the coming celebration of the Three Days, and few passages give such clear voice to those contrasting touchstones as the Christ hymn in Philippians 2.

Our Wednesday services will alternate between here at St. Petri and at Bergen in Roland. This series will feature a different preacher each week, with a total of five ELCA pastors from some of the Riverside Conference churches.

Our Lenten journey culminates in Holy Week which begins with the Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday, March 29th. (Sunday 10:00 AM)

Since at least the fourth century and universally in the church since the eighth, Christians have kept the Sunday before Easter as a memorial of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and a literal procession of palms, started in Jerusalem, has spread throughout the world. This Sunday a reading from Matthew 21 with a palm procession marks the opening of worship. Another ancient practice is to observe the Sunday before Easter as Sunday of the Passion, and so a longer reading from the passion in Matthew functions as the gospel of the day. This service, which inaugurates the most important week of the Christian year, has a two-part focus: Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and his passion and death.

We enter the Holy "Three Days"

Maundy Thursday, April 2nd. (Thursday 7:00PM at Bergen, Pastor Tim preaching, youth lead liturgy)

Christian theologians have taught that the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ must be held together to be adequately understood. Thus, it was that since at least the fourth century, the Christianized Passover festival that English-speakers call Easter took three days, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the first communion of Easter. The Three Days begins on Maundy Thursday with an act of confession and absolution that concludes the season of Lent and prepares everyone for the baptismal renewals of Easter. "Mandatum," the "command" to love is the source of the term Maundy. The eucharist recalls Jesus' last meal with his disciples before his death. The service concludes with a stripping of the worship space of all adornment, in preparation for Good Friday.

Good Friday, April 3rd. (Friday 7:00PM at Bergen, youth led Tenebrae service)

In ancient times this second of the Three Days was called the Triumph of the Cross. English speakers call the day Good because we know the end of the story, for the Three Days carries us into the resurrection. Friday's Bible readings present several quite different ways to think about the death of Christ: Christ is the lamb, Christ is the high priest, and Christ is the king reigning from the cross. Christ is both human and divine: he suffers, and he is the I AM. The service concludes when at the foot of the life-giving cross, we pray for everyone and everything on earth and engage in a ritual of reverence for the cross on which hung Christ, the Savior of the whole world.

The Vigil of Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord, April 4th. (Available online beginning Saturday)

The Vigil of Easter, the most solemn and joyous celebration of the resurrection of our Lord, is traditionally composed of four parts: the lighting of the paschal fire, the service of readings, baptisms and baptismal renewal, and communion; we will only be doing the service of readings. Our youth will be presenting the 12 readings which will be available for viewing on Saturday through Facebook. Through these readings the church proclaims many biblical images of divine salvation. Each can be seen as picturing God, Christ's resurrection, and the baptismal life.

The Resurrection of Our Lord: Easter Day, April 5th. (Sunday 10:00AM)


By the second century, Christians had shaped Passover into an annual celebration of Christ's resurrection, having agreed to keep this Christianized Pascha on the Sunday following the Jewish festival. Since to be Christian is to believe in the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, observing Easter

became the primary mark of a practicing Christian. (Portions from Sundays and Seasons, Augsburg Fortress, 2011)

This is the high holy season of the church year. These are the worship services that focus on the core of our faith. I pray that God will bless us richly as we worship during this holy season.



Council Meeting Approved Minutes
December 14, 2025**

Present: Angie Rieck-Hinz, Travis DeRidder, Rick Stover, Angie Stover, Ann Healy, Kelsey Olson, Abby Patterson, Pastor Tim Malek Absent: Pat Murken

Meeting called to order at 11:23 a.m. Kelsey offered Devotions.

Angie S. presented the November Minutes for approval. Kelsey made a motion to accept the minutes as written; Travis seconded. No discussion. Motion passed.

Rick presented the Treasurer's Report. He presented the November checks written and the November journal entries. Angie R-H approved the November checks. Rick noted that, although income minus expenses for November was in the negative, the church's total budget remains in the positive. There was much discussion regarding the new floor-cleaning device (Robby the Roomba), for which payment has been deducted from the General Maintenance account. Other items discussed included the St. Petri t-shirts, for which payment still needs to be reconciled with expenses and moved from the Parable of the Talents fund to the Reserve fund. The Taste of Norway event earned approximately \$1400; Money remains in the Community Meal fund and Nancy Carlson's sister-in-law donated \$5,000 to the fund for the electronic keypad lock planned at the southeast entrance. Angie R-H asked Council members to consider how the expected budget surplus should be dispersed to "zero out" for the year. Ideas include: A gift to the Synod, the livestream program, various computers in the church and the church phone. Travis made a motion to accept the information as presented; Ann seconded. No discussion. Motion passed

Pastor said that the mutual "trial period" for Custodian Deb Lancaster has concluded. He said "she is a delight, she is loving getting to know the congregation

and that she is open to learning." He further updated members on the new vacuuming system. He noted that the Christmas Appeal letter has been mailed. Finally, there was discussion regarding ideas for the church's return address and its labeling as well as the issue of leaving the church's glass entry doors clear.

Ann reported that she is working on the Head Usher schedule for 2026.

Abby and Pastor Tim agreed he will choose hymns for the December 28th service and that she is planning for January.

Pastor Tim reported for Pat on the bids from Watson Plumbing on the parsonage sink, and he made members aware that there is a leak in the church roof. Since the church roof is still under warranty, the plan is to have the company who installed it look into it soon.

Kelsey reported that the Sunday School food drive at Thanksgiving was a success. The Sunday School Christmas party is scheduled for Sunday, December 21 and that Sunday School will take a break and will resume on January 11.

No Old Business

New Business: The Council accepts with regret Michaela Fevold's request to be removed from the church roll and wishes her Godspeed. There was much discussion on the church Facebook pages and how to combine them. Travis has agreed to serve as President next year. Angie R-H hopes to continue updating church policies and the constitution. She reminded members to get their budgets to Pat soon and their annual reports to Veronica before the next meeting. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, January 19.

There is a vacancy for a Vice President and a chair for the Property and Trustees committee.

Meeting adjourned at 12:24 p.m. and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
