St. Petri Evangelical Lutheran Church Approved Council Meeting Minutes September 14, 2025

Present: Angie Rieck-Hinz, Travis DeRidder, Rick Stover, Angie Stover, Ann Healy, Pat Murken, Kelsey Olson, Abby Patterson, Pastor Tim Malek



Meeting called to order at 11:22 a.m. Abby offered Devotions.

Angie S. presented the September Minutes for approval. Angie S. made a motion to accept the minutes as written; Kelsey seconded. No discussion. Motion carried.

Rick presented the Treasurer's Report. He presented the September checks written and Angie R–H approved them. Rick noted that Rolfe and Margaret Johnstad requested \$1,075 designated in memory of their daughter be moved to the Church Sign fund. Ann made a motion to accept the report as presented; Abby seconded. No discussion. Motion carried.

Pastor reported that the Synod Council meeting was yesterday, 9/13, and that one item discussed there was that the group Lutheran Congregational Support Network is working against the ELCA. He agreed that it would be a good idea to put information in the newsletter to explain more of what the group is doing. Pastor has continuing education hours scheduled in October and the Tri-Synodical meeting is the end of September in Clive. He noted that the St. Petri Parable of the Talents event is being moved from November to sometime in the Spring.

Ann reported that St. Petri gave away 200 hot dogs as well as lemonade at the R–S Serves event in the park at the end of August. St. Petri's Homecoming event is scheduled for September 21 and the Senior Lunch will be September 25. Sunday School youth will help make decorations for the luncheon.

Abby reported that God's Work Our Hands activities went well and shared LSI's and Bethany

Manor's appreciation of what they received. She touched on the September Homecoming event and said St. Petri will host some form of Trunk or Treat at the end of October.

Pat reported that the Black Hills Energy service contract will be canceled after one more service call and Watson Plumbing fixed a leaky outside faucet. Pat also made the Council aware that the new copier contract will change from \$533 to \$210 per month and will be effective for five years.

Kelsey reported that the Sunday School area has been "spruced up." The kids are scheduled to sing at the 9/21 service. Also, four kids will be receiving a Spark Bible and one third-grader will be receiving an updated Bible. Kelsey expressed her appreciation that Sarah Holm has volunteered to serve as a Sunday School backup teacher and that the Sunday School program continues to grow.

Old Business: St. Petri continues to pursue funding for an electronic keypad entry at the south entrance. Angie R-H is submitting an application for a Story County Community Foundation Service Grant.

New Business: A follow-up performance review was held with Veronica where it was decided to retroactively give her a 3% pay raise effective August 1. Pat proposed a motion to give Veronica a 3% pay raise; Ann seconded. No discussion. Motion carried.

St. Petri serves at Loaves and Fishes September 27 and it plans to serve another community meal there on October 11. Ann is working to secure two volunteers for the Finance Committee for December and Pat is going to place ads looking to hire a Custodian.

Meeting adjourned at 12:20 p.m. and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

JOB DESCRIPTIONS

The **PRESIDENT** shall preside at the meetings of the Congregation Council, congregation and Executive Committee.

In the absence of the president, the **VICE PRESIDENT** shall preside at meetings of the Congregation Council, congregation and Executive Committee.

The **SECRETARY** shall keep the minutes of the Congregation Council, congregation and Executive Committee and have custody of the archives of the congregation.

The **TREASURER** shall have custody of all funds of the congregation and shall receive and disburse such funds in accordance with the decisions of the Congregation Council or the congregation.

A **NOMINATING COMMITTEE** of four voting members of this congregation, two of whom, if possible, shall be outgoing members of the Congregation Council, shall be elected at the annual meeting for a term of one year. Members of the Nominating Committee are not eligible for consecutive reelection.

ENDOWMENT FUND COMMITTEE - The St. Petri Mission Endowment Fund (hereafter named the FUND) is established to provide vehicles and structure for members who have the ability and desire to benefit St. Petri Lutheran Church through charitable giving that is consistent with our mission of being disciples of Jesus Christ and making disciples on both a local and global level. The purpose of the FUND is to promote long-term funding of specific programs that support Christ's mission and ensure our financial stability. This fund will not fully replace any regular budgeted items, or take the place of regular giving by St. Petri members. The COMMITTEE, which oversees the FUND, will seek to provide a perpetual source of income for the purposes designated.

FINANCE COMMITTEE – Recording and depositing contributions.

COORDINATOR JOB DESCRIPTIONS

a. Christian Fellowship Coordinator

- 1. Attend monthly council meetings to report on progress of tasks and to make requests/motions to the council
- 2. Prepare a written report for the annual meeting of the congregation
- 3. Prepare publicity pieces (newsletter, bulletin, temple talk) as needed
- 4. Recommend to the Property/Trustees Committee annual budget requests
- 5. Establish and coordinate a network of helpers to complete the following tasks:
 - i. Organize & coordinate volunteers for weekly, monthly, seasonal, and annual activities of the congregation as needed. These activities may include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Worship Volunteers & Hospitality (Head usher, ushers, taxi, greeters, etc.)
 - 2. Grounds Volunteers (Snow removal & Lawn Care)
 - 3. Special congregational events (such as: Turkey Supper, Kumla Feed & Senior Luncheon)
 - 4. Other fellowship & congregational activities as desired.
 - 5. Funeral volunteer coordination (hospitality & luncheon volunteers)
 - ii. Coordinate ELCA events and ELCA materials (World hunger, refugee/immigration, advocacy)
 - iii. Coordinate activities to consider faithful stewardship campaigns including automatic donations, pledge drive, etc.

b. Worship Community Coordinator

- 1. Attend monthly council meetings to report on progress of tasks and to make requests/motions to the council
- 2. Prepare a written report for the annual meeting of the congregation
- 3. Prepare publicity pieces (newsletter, bulletin, temple talk) as needed
- 4. Recommend to the Property/Trustees Committee annual budget requests
- 5. Establish and coordinate a network of helpers to complete the following tasks:
 - i. Choose hymns monthly
 - ii. Organ/piano/handbell maintenance (line up tuners, advise & approve on repairs)
 - iii. Decorate sanctuary seasonally (cross drapes, advent/Christmas decorations, Harvest theme in fall, Lent/Easter)
 - iv. Work with Pastor on Special Services
 - v. Organize poinsettias/Easter lilies
 - vi. Plan special music and guest musicians/concerts
 - vii. Prepare new member welcome baskets
- viii. Mailing of bulletins for shut-ins
 - ix. Be actively involved in the selection of the missionary supported by St. Petri and keep the congregation informed of missionary work and their needs
 - x. Communion assistance on communion Sundays
 - xi. Communion visits to shut-ins
- xii. Visits to shut-ins (non-communion related)
- xiii. Mid-week prayer services
- xiv. Lectern/assisting minister list coordination
- xv. Coordinating care for members (illness, etc.)

c. Faith Formation Coordinator

- 1. Attend monthly council meetings to report on progress of tasks and to make requests/motions to the council
- 2. Prepare a written report for the annual meeting of the congregation
- 3. Prepare publicity pieces (newsletter, bulletin, temple talk) as needed (Constitutional Changes cont.)
- 4. Recommend to the Property/Trustees Committee annual budget requests
- 5. Establish and coordinate a network of helpers to complete the following tasks as needed in collaboration with the ministry staff:
 - i. Provide leadership training opportunities for youth
 - ii. Generation of a search committee and job description for a paid youth worker as needed
 - iii. Coordinate fellowship hour receptions for both Confirmation and Graduation Sundays
 - iv. Pick adult education curriculum
 - v. Supervise and coordinate all Cross+Generational Ministry
 - vi. Coordinate youth programing and adult support for programing
 - vii. Grant camper-ships/scholarships for Bible camps and other youth leadership programming
 - viii. Organize Vacation Bible School program

d. Property and Trustees Coordinator

- 1. Attend monthly council meetings to report on progress of tasks and to make requests/motions to the council
- 2. Prepare a written report for the annual meeting of the congregation
- 3. Prepare publicity pieces (newsletter, bulletin, temple talk) as needed
- 4. Work with the elected committee members to complete the following tasks:
 - i. Establish a list of 3-5 resource people, resident experts, or reserve workers to be called on for consultation, project planning, or simply an available labor pool.
 - ii. Building and grounds maintenance of church and parsonage
 - 1. Organize congregational work days for church maintenance and repairs (raking leaves, painting, trimming bushes, shrubs, trees, care of flowers and plantings, care of outside planters and landscaping)
 - 2. Regularly inspect church and parsonage for repairs and maintenance needs
 - 3. Make minor repairs at the church
 - 4. Review and authorize repairs and maintenance requests
 - 5. Designate use of various parts of church for functions
 - 6. Oversee specially designated committees in relation to repairs and fundraising for repairs
 - 7. Complete/oversee parsonage restore and renew projects
- iii. Draft and recommend policies for use of church to be adopted by church council including the following:
 - 1. Vehicle safety policy
 - 2. Parsonage use policy
 - 3. Electronic communication
 - 4. Custodial duties
 - 5. Usage and fees policy
 - 6. Travel expenses policy
 - 7. Employee credit card policy
- iv. Generation of a search committee for church custodian
- v. Supervise legal matters including all insurance; review compliance and policy annually
- vi. Prepare and recommend the annual budget to Congregation Council
- vii. Hire and supervise work of custodian
- viii. Oversee the budget and church expenditures
- ix. Ascertain that expenditures are within the approved budget
- x. Recommend to Congregation Council any fiscal restraints (in consultation with the treasurer) that may be needed for cash flow purposes
- xi. Coordinate projects with the Endowment Committee.
- xii. Recommends salary changes for church employees and professional staff to the council Work with all other committees or groups on joint church projects
