Clubs MUST contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.


The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

Again, we had several midweek games in the **Senior Division**.

On **Tuesday**, the big game at the Newman Collard saw Crofton Saints win 3-2 to continue their unbeaten record in their debut season at this level against another of the fancied teams, Liss Athletic. Dye scored a late winner for the visitors.

Denmead also had another excellent result as they won 3-0 at Whitehill & Bordon, still yet to win, to remain unbeaten. Jellinek scored two for Denmead.

Bishops Waltham Dynamos also lost their unbeaten record in a 2-3 defeat at Southsea Sports, whose first win this was. A double from Petrov helped Sports, despite Medcalf's two for Dynamos.

Stockbridge suffered their third defeat on the trot as they lost 2-3 at home to Hook. Jones, R.Goddard and Roxburgh were on target for Hook.

Wednesday saw two more unbeaten teams play each other at the Cockleshell. Locks Heath's 3-0 win over Meon Milton continued their excellent start to the season. Clark, Kilty and McNulty scored for Locks.

On **Saturday**, we had a full complement of Senior Division matches, and it was also the first day of the Division 1 season, with almost all teams in action.

The **Senior Division** matches saw three teams clear at the top of the fledgling league table, all undefeated. Denmead continued their great start with a 2-1 home win over Liphook United, the Mead's scorers were Hopwood and Jellinek, and they now have thirteen points from five games. Locks Heath had a big 7-1 win at bottom club Stockbridge (seven different scorers) to make it four wins out of four, and Crofton Saints had a good 4-0 home win to inflict Andover Town's third consecutive defeat. Ryman got two of Saints' goals.

Bishops Waltham Dynamos have now suffered two defeats after a good start, the latest a 0-1 home reverse to new boys Broughton, another team who seem to be adjusting well to life in the higher league. Coltart got the winner. So do AFC Shirley, who this week played out an entertainong 3-3 draw at Meon Milton after being twice behind. Well-known at higher levels of local football, Owen Fee made his debut for AFC Shirley. Whitehill & Bordon were also involved in a good game as they overcame Moneyfields Res (for whom Close scorerd two) 4-3 at the Daly. Southsea Sports lost their first two games but have since won ther last two, this time a 3-1 home win over Hedge End Rangers. Liss Athletic got back on track after last week's defeat as they beat Hook 2-1, Finch with an injury-time winner.

In **Division 1** the first group of games saw a big win for Overton United, who just missed out on promotion last season, 6-1 at Whiteley Wanderers. Martin and Hargood scored two each. Promoted BTC Southampton won their first game with a 3-2 win at last season's bottom club, Twentyten. Adams, Moulsdale and Reynolds were on target for

BTC, Obieli and Grainger for Twentyten. Two teams who will be hoping to do well this season played each other at Romsey, AFC Netley beating Hayling United 4-1, Schmedlin scoring two of their goals. Relegated Paulsgrove lost 0-2 at Nursling & Shirley (formerly QK Southampton) who finished last season strongly. Portlock and sub Bridle with the N&S goals. The other two matches ended in draws; relgated Sway got a good 1-1 result at Silchester Village, for whom Vickers scored, and Mob Albion and Rushmoor Community shared six goals at the KGV in Cosham.

Match Reports

Stockbridge 2 Hook 3

A pleasant evening at Stockbridge with a well-prepared pitch. Good crowd, with the ever-present Stockbridge faithful present.

A lively start from both sides and the first corner to Stocks after only five minutes. Following a throw-in the ball found its way to Hook's Andy Roxborough who shot wide. Ryan Goddard of Hook, who was very busy all night, then found himself on goal which produced a great stop by Finn Graydon, the Stocks keeper, and after 39 minutes Graydon was on hand again to block an effort from Roxborough. But on 44 mins a good ball found Goddard who managed to get his cross in from the tightest of angles for Rasani to to make it 1-0 to Hook. And only a minute later Goddard found himself with a one on one with the Stocks keeper and made no mistake, making it 0-2 at the break.

The Robins came out for the second half with much more purpose and threatened the Hook goal a couple of times. However, a low cross on 69 minutes was fumbled by the unfortunate Graydon to allow Hook to make it

0-3. It appeared that this would be the final score, but the home side continued to press and in the 95th minute a cross which was not collected by Lewis allowed Ryan Stanger to bring the score back to 1-3. They were not finished and on 98 minutes we had the highlight of the night with ball breaking to Ollie Landreath about 28 yards out who hit a brilliant shot to make the score 2-3.

Meon Milton 0 Locks Heath 3

A completely different evening to the previous night at Stockbridge, dull and overcast. Pitch was surprisingly green, I noticed a water bowser nearby and guessed there had been a measure of irrigation, well done Meon.

A very bright start from Locks Heath and after only two minutes a little flick from the right-hand side into the Meon box allowed Adam Clark to open the scoring for Locks 0-1. Locks continued to press Meon playing some very good football. On 17 minutes a Locks corner from the right-hand side aimed at the far post was met with a good header from Ellis Kilty to make it 0-2. For the next 20 minutes Locks Heath were very much on the front foot particularly down the flanks where they looked most effective. There was a brief stoppage on about 35 minutes to attend to Kilty who crashed rather awkwardly into the goal post.

The second half started with a little less intensity and neither side were able to capitalise. On 71 minutes Meon were awarded a free kick 25 yards out but their effort was tipped over the bar by Owen Johns in the Locks Heath goal. Very few chances came to either side but on 77 minutes from a corner on the right-hand side was not cleared by Meon and Joel McNalty fired it in to make it 0-3 to Locks Heath A good night for Locks Heath who maintain their unbeaten record.
