A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

No midweek games were played this week, but we do have several Bank Holiday Monday games coming up, which will be covered in the next edition of Hog Post.

On **Saturday** we also had several games in both divisions.

The **Senior Division** matches saw Locks Heath go to the top of the early-season table as they notched their fifth win out of five, an impressive 3-0 win at Broughton, with a hat-trick from Rogers.

AFC Shirley recorded a good 3-1 at Whitehill & Bordon to move into fourth – they summarised it here:

'A great win on the road for the Owls. Whitehill took the lead from a corner that should have been dealt with. The Owls then got a penalty after Burt was clattered by the

Whitehill keeper. Brogan smashed the penalty into the bar keeping the score at 1-0. Burt then cleverly played in Mandigora who was barged over clumsily by the Whitehill defender. Wood stepped up and converted coolly. 1-1 at HT. Second half the Owls were brighter and took a 2-1 lead after Hughes put in a great ball, Read won the header, and Mandigora finished on the volley powerfully. Whitehill came on strong and had great chances to equalise. In added time, the Owls countered, Fagelman breaking and setting up L.Vidler for a tap in. A great win for the Owls considering we had 12 unavailable'. Hook moved into fifth after also doing well on their travels, a 3-2 win at Liphook United, the winner coming from an own goal.

The other game saw Stockbridge pick up a point in a 2-2 home draw with Hedge End Rangers, the visitors coming back from two goals down. Sanger and Shepherd were on target for the Robins.

In **Division 1** Overton United recorded their second big win in a row, 4-0 at relegated Paulsgrove. Hargood got a hat-trick for Overton. Nursling & Shirley are revelling in their new name as they also recorded their second win, a big 6-0 result at home to Rushmoor Community. Eccleston and Portlock both scored two for N&S. Silchester Village picked up a good 3-2 win at BTC to spoil things for the hosts in their first home game after their promotion. Burgess, Ledger and Stratton were on target for Silchester. Last season's bottom two came back well from first day defeats: Twentyten, helped by two goals by Bromley, had an excellent 4-0 win at Hayling United, whose second defeat this was, and Whiteley Wanderers had a 3-2 home win against Headley United. Relegated Sway also had a 3-2 home win, against Mob Albion, with two penalties from Booker.

Match Report

Sway 3 Mob Albion 2

Beautiful warm day, but a battle to get through the Bank Holiday traffic across the forest. Mr Pratt allowed a little extra time for all of the Mob Albion players to get ready. KO was at 15:18. Two quite young sides.

A good start by Sway, and after only two minutes a good run by Ethan Miles down the right and a perfect cross allowed Charlie Blake to score. Sway were pushing to increase the lead and Miles who was very dangerous, the whole game created a number of chances. On 28 minutes a Sway player was bundled over in the box and Mr Pratt had no hesitation awarding a penalty which was converted by Ash Booker. Sway continued to press but at half time the score remained at 2-0.

After 55 minutes a second penalty for Sway, and again Ash Booker put it away to make it three. The game changed after 60 minutes when Mike McLeod of Sway received a straight red card for what appeared to be a stamp. Mob Albion took advantage of the situation and continued to make life difficult for Sway, They got the breakthrough on 70 minutes which saw a nice move with the ball coming out to Cam Bridge who took his goal well. Mob really pushed to get a result and got some reward on 83 minutes a deep corner from the right hand side was headed home by Ben Kasaski. 3-2
