Clubs MUST contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.


The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

In **midweek** we had one Senior Division match, and it saw Andover Town gain their first point of the season at the sixth attempt after a 2-2 draw with Hook. Holden and Morgans for the Blues, Chattell and Roxburgh for Hook.

A couple of Southampton Senior Cup matches were also scheduled, and AFC Netley ran Wessex Prem Millbrook very close, coming back from two downonly to lose 2-3 to a late goal from White. Sway unfortunately couldn't raise a side to play Bemerton.

On **Saturday** it was the first round of the uhlsport Hampshire Premier League Cup. As ever, there were a range of interesting matchups, and the possibility of some surprise results, as over half the ties were between Senior Division and Division One clubs.

Two of the all-Senior Division clashes that both involved teams in the top seven; Meon Milton had an exciting match with holders Crofton Saints, who were three up at half time and hung on to win 4-3, Nasiadka with their winner, and Bishops Waltham Dynamos played second-placed Locks Heath in their return to Priory Park but lost 2-5. Tiffin was on target twice for Locks. Two teams in the bottom five had tough away trips, Stockbridge lost 0-4 at Southsea Sports, for whom Blofield got two, and Moneyfields Res lost 0-5 at Hook.

Three all-Division One games featured a battle of the top two, as Overton United were at home to Nursling & Shirley. It was the visitors who came out on top with a 2-1 win, the crucial goal coming from Goncalves. They meet again in the league next Saturday. BTC Southampton have started the season well but lost 2-5 at home to Hedge End Town, and Sway beat Twentyten 2-1 in a close game.

Some of the ties that involved teams from different divisions provided some interesting results. The shock of the round was probably Paulsgrove, bottom of Div 1, holding Liphook United to a 3-3 draw and then winning on penalties. Another upset was AFC Netley, who have started well in Div 1, winning 5-1 at Andover Town, bottom of the Senior Division. Senior Division leaders Denmead overcame a potentially tricky trip to Div 1 Rushmoor Community with a 5-2 victory, coming back from two down; Jenkinson got a double for the Mead. Senior Division Whitehill & Bordon had the expected hard game against Div 1 Silchester Village, but came away with a 1-0 home victory thanks to a Gill penalty.

The other games involved the rest of the bottom five teams in Div 1 facing Senior Division opponents, the majority of them away. AFC Shirley laboured to a 2-1 win over Whiteley Wanderers, the winner a late one by Huggett, Broughton had a 2-0 win over Mob Albion, with goals from Mumford and Welch. Liss Athletic won 2-1 at Hayling United thanks to goals from Kracmar and Glazier, and Hedge End Rangers beat Headley United 7-1 in their first match at their new home at Sholing FC, Caws helping himself to two goals.

All losing teams today will enter the George Mason Memorial Shield.

Match Report

Hedge End Rangers 7 Headley U. 1

This was the first match of Hedge End Rangers' groundshare at Sholing. Given the league positions, the scoreline may not look too surprising, but the visitors did well for most of the game, four goals in the last 25 mins meaning they will probably feel a bit hard done by at the end. The home side, fifth last season, have not had a great start to this term, but gained confidence as the game went on, with some good passing on their new pitch, so this was a useful game for them.

The hosts began well and an early corner reached Dilley in the middle but his effort was just over. But his side took the lead on 9 mins as a cross from the left beyond the far post was played back well for Bickley to tap in. The visitors battled well and looked dangerous on the break, but were undone again on 14 mins by a good 30-yard shot by Bragginton which found the top corner. Rangers nearly got another one as Caws cut in from the left but his shot was deflected wide. At the other end a break saw Benstead show great strength to get past two defenders but his shot was deflected at the last minute just wide. The visitors continued to compete well, although some pinball in the Headley area ended with Caws' effort going wide. On 38 mins the visitors reduced the deficit with a superb strike from distance by captain Nicholls. They were back in it, but suffered a blow almost on the break as Hammerton extended the home side's lead again with a header. HT 3-1.





After the restart Rangers looked to add to their lead, sub Nichols had a shot saved, then a cross from the right saw Caws, stretching at the far post, also test keeper Hooper. Bickley also had an effort wide, but the visitors were again resisting well until the 65 minute mark, when a good cross from the left by Parker was unfortunately turned into his own net by Nichols. Another goal four mins later from Caws from a cross from Hurst (who had a great second half) on the right put the home side out of sight, and they started to play with more freedom as the visitors seemed to tire. Headley had one big chance, where home keeper Wragg atoned for a misplaced clearance by making two excellent blocks when Headley seemed certain to score, but the home side had a few more chances before adding to their total with goals by Caws on 84 mins (a good finish from a Hurst cross) and sub Nicholls on 86 mins, another cross by Hurst being headed on by Caws for a good finish. Hickey came close for the visitors at the end with a shot curled wide, but this was a successful debut at their new home for HER, who go into the hat for the next round. Headley will have the consolation of playing in the George Mason Memorial Shield.

There was a nice family atmosphere (as there always is at Rangers' games) with the tea bar and marquee bar doing a good trade. Even the scoreboard was in action. We wish the team all the best in their new home [Paul H]
