POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - across any competition - it is the clubs responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (alan.gower2@ntlworld.com) and League Secretary (paulcrocker71@gmail.com) - as soon as possible.

Clubs **MUST** contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

Changing Rooms

Please remember to show respect and to leave the changing rooms as you would like to find them after a match. We received several complaints already this season that rooms have been left dirty and even damaged.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

***Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.**

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

PORTSMOUTH SENIOR CUP

Paulsgrove	1 - 3	Locks Heath
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Round-Up

Again, no midweek matches involving our teams this week, and on **Saturday** we saw a large number of cup games, with a lot of travelling for some of our sides. There were also some league games in each division.

It was the first round of the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy**, and it was a good day for our teams.

No less than four of our clubs had to make the expensive and windy journey across the Solent to play on the Isle of Wight, and three of them came away with a victory. Shanklin have done well in the IOW league recently, but Whitehill & Bordon recorded an excellent 2-1 win, thanks to goals from Gill and Reffell. Two teams currently in the lower half of the IOW table were Oakfield, who lost 0-5 to Meon Milton, for whom Easen and Appleby scored two each, and Northwood St Johns, who lost on penalties to Headley United. The hardest trip was for Rushmoor Community, who were at Whitecroft & Barton Sports, regular winners of the IOW league and current unbeaten leaders, but they ran their opponents close, only losing 1-2.

We had only one team playing a Southampton League team this time; Stockbridge faced a tricky trip to Dynamo Dockside but came out of it well, winning 3-0.

Neither of the games involving HPFL sides against reserve/U23 teams, who are a bit of an unknown quantity, took place; Southsea Sports had a walkover against Bashley U23, and Bishops Waltham Dynamos' game at United Services Portsmouth Res was postponed.

We also had three all-HPFL matchups, both Hedge End teams were at home, Town took last year's beaten finalists Crofton Saints all the way to penalties before going out at the NormRod, whereas in-form Rangers had a top five clash against Denmead at the Deer Park, and scored seven without reply. Overton United, top of Div 1, beat Moneyfields Res, in the lower reaches of the Senior Division, in a close encounter by a single goal from Schofield.

In the **Senior Division**, leaders AFC Shirley went down 1-2 at Liss Athletic, Finch and Glazier on target for the hosts, who have now risen to fifth. Hook are now in fourth thanks to a 3-0 home win over Broughton.

In **Division 1**, the big game at Romsey saw home team AFC Netley beat Silchester Village 2-1 to move above them into second. Paul Evans writes:

'On a windy day in Romsey it was third v second in the league and for the first ten minutes it was Silchester that were on top with a long throw which coursed all sorts of problems for the Netley defence, but on 21 mins a corner for Netley, and they took the lead from it. Silchester pushed for the equaliser and got it on 27 mins from George Greaves.

In the second half both teams tried hard for a winner - good saves from both keepers to keep the scores level - but on 82 min a defensive mistake led to Netley scoring and that's how it finished'.

Fourth-placed BTC Southampton had a 2-1 home win over Mob Albion, and Nursling & Shirley, in fifth, got back to form after last weekend's big defeat with a 4-2 home win over Twentyten. Hayling United had a good 4-2 win at Sway to move into mid-table.

We had one more cup game; in the **Portsmouth Senior Cup**, Locks Heath avoided a potential banana skin with a 3-1 win at Paulsgrove, who have been in good cup form. Rogers (2) and Clark were the Locks scorers.

Match Report

Nursling and Shirley 4 Twenty Ten 2

Very little of note in the first 10 minutes apart from one shot from Twenty Ten which was a couple of feet wide. There was a decent cross from Nursling which was wasted, and a shot from Fairless from 20 yards which was well over the bar. On 20 minutes a through split the Twenty Ten defence which found two Nursling forwards free of the defenders and Kristain Cozzorina took full advantage. There was no flag from the Twenty Ten lino and the referee gave the goal. The lino was replaced shortly afterwards. On 38 minutes a hopeful ball into the Twenty Ten box fell favourably to George Fairless, who took full advantage to make it 2-0

So 2-0 at half time with little on show but lots of high balls swirling around in the wind.



On 48 minutes a corner for Twenty Ten was delivered at the perfect height and was converted at the far post by Dore to make it 2-1. Two minutes later a penalty was awarded to Twenty Ten, which was well taken by Tom Skinner, and the scores were level. On 71 minutes the ball was swung in from the right into the Twenty Ten area and was well taken by Nathan Newman to make it 3-2, and N&S increased their lead on 79 minutes after a corner fell to Nathan Newman who headed in to make the final score 4-2. Not a classic by any means but the awful weather did not help either team.
