A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

This time there was actually a midweek match involving our clubs - it saw Bishops Waltham Dynamos travelling to Wessex One Fleetlands in the Russell Cotes Cup, and despite a 1-3 defeat they gave a good account of themselves. Steele got their goal.

On **Saturday** we had a full league programme planned for the first time in ages. A lot of the top teams played each other, in both divisions, so there was no shortage of talking points.

In the **Senior Division**, disappointingly, there were a couple of postponements. Locks Heath now top the table after a good 3-1 home win over Liss Athletic, for whom Lenox scored. Hook rose to second after an even more impressive 3-0 home win over erstwhile leaders AFC Shirley. Our man at Hook writes:

' Hook welcomed AFC Shirley to KGV for the second consecutive week, this time in league action following Shirley's penalty shootout win in the league cup.

The visitors had the better of the first period, going close when a header hit the bar. But Hook got the upper hand right on halftime. A corner was not cleared properly and Morris hovering on the edge of the box slammed home from 20 yards.

Shirley were not at their best and were unable to come back from this. Thompson doubled the home side's advantage and Roxburgh put gloss on the scoreline with a third from the penalty spot.'

Denmead go back to fifth after a second successive away win, this time 3-1 at Bishops Waltham Dynamos, thanks to three second half goals. Hedge End Rangers' run of seven successive wins was ended by a 1-1 draw, only salvaged thanks to a late penalty at the Deer Park, with second-bottom Stockbridge, who are still level with Liphook United and Southsea Sports, who shared six goals in an exciting game at Liphook Rec. Whitehill & Bordon and Meon Milton are still mid-table after their 2-2 draw at the Daly.

In **Division 1**, the top four clubs all played each other, and the top two both came out on top. Overton United made it seven out of seven with a 4-1 home win over Silchester, two of those from Hargood, and AFC Netley remain three points behind them after a 2-1 home win against BTC Southampton. Blaxall and a late one from Rushent gave Netley the points. Nursling & Shirley took advantage of these results to move into third with a 3-0 home win over Sway. Cozzolino, Newman and Munnoch were on target for the hosts. The bottom three all lost away; Paulsgrove by 0-2 at Rushmoor Community (Griffiths and Morris scoring for the Rush) , Headley United by 2-4 at Twentyten, and Whiteley Wanderers by 2-3 at Hedge End Town. A remarkable scoreline saw Hayling United continue their recent improvement with an 8-3 win at Mob Albion, their third victory on the trot. Clark got a hat-trick for the Humbugs, Frost weighed in with a double.
