A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas


*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

No midweek games, but we had a full league programme on Saturday.

In the **Senior Division**, the top four clubs all won. Leaders Locks Heath made it nine wins out of ten after a 3-0 home win over Andover Town, two of those from Clark. Second-placed Hook had an excellent 3-1 home win over Hedge End Rangers. AFC Shirley, in third, had a 3-0 win at second-bottom Stockbridge, Vidler, Hughes and Brogan their scorers, and just behind them, Crofton Saints had a 4-0 win over third-bottom Liphook United in their last home game before their groundshare at Gosport. Southon, Broadway, Steele and Nasiadka were on target for Crofton. Fifth-placed Denmead slipped to a 1-2 defeat at Moneyfields Res (Ewens and West were the Moneys scorers), and were overtaken by Liss Athletic, 3-2 winners at home over Meon Milton thanks to a late McWilliams winner. Southsea Sports gave themselves some breathing space over the bottom four with an excellent 5-2 win at Whitehill & Bordon (a Tricker hat-trick and two from Vickers for the visitors), and Broughton and Bishops Waltham Dynamos drew 1-1 whick keeps both teams in mid-table. Bosma got a late equaliser for the Dynamos.

In **Division 1,** the top two both won, Overton with a narrow 1-0 home win over Twentyten, Hargood with the vital goal, and AFC Netley with a resounding 7-1 away win at Headley United, with seven different scorers. Silchester Village moved back above Nursling & Shirley into third after beating them 4-0 at home, two of them from Barrington. BTC Southampton, in fifth, have a game in hand over those two and should ultimately be pleased with a point after a 2-2 draw at in-form Hayling United, although McCarthy got a very late equaliser for the Bugs. Hedge End Town also have games in hand and moved into sixth after a good 3-0 win at Rushmoor Community. At the bottom, Paulsgrove lost 1-5 at home to Mob Albion, who move into ninth as a result, and Sway moved into tenth after a big 7-2 home victory over Whiteley Wanderers.

Match Reports

Whitehill & Bordon 2 Southsea Sports 5

A first visit to the Daly Ground for the writer since April 1985 (Army v Hampshire) and it's changed a fair bit since then, but it's great to have this venue staging football once more. This was a goal-filled match, starting with a goal after only 73 seconds when Sports' Davey Blofield was well placed in the box and squared it to the even better placed Logan Vickers to fire home. There were no further goals until first half stoppage time but plenty of drama. Whitehill had more of the ball and were a greater threat, their closest came when Dillon Bonner's inswinging corner beat everyone in the middle but came off the inside of the far post and into the grateful hands of visitors' keeper Cody Burchill. In time added (mainly due to a head injury early on) Whitehill levelled when Bonner crossed from the right, Henry Smith's header was well blocked by Burchill but Shane Warren was there to fire home. So, level at half-time, no not the case as an excellent counter attacking goal put the Sports back in front when Logan Vickers crossed, it flicked off a defender to Vinny Tricker at the back stick who finished well.

Into the second half and the home side levelled it up on 66 minutes when Lucas Sheppard's cross was neatly headed home by Ollie Graham. Once again, parity didn't last long as Tricker showed excellent vision to find Vickers who was upended just in the box - penalty. Up stepped Vickers to send the home keeper the wrong way and the Sports now 3-2 ahead. Whitehill tried to hit back but the Sports defended well, getting in some important blocks. The visitors added a fourth on 79 minutes with Tricker showing fine poise and control in a tight space to open a gap and place it low into the net. They made it five when Michael Griffin's long throw down the line sent Vickers on a chase and he got to the dead ball line, pulled it back and Tricker was there again to fire home and complete his hat-trick. FT: 2-5.

Whitehill played a full part in an entertaining game but Southsea Sports took their opportunities and the points too. [with thanks to Gary D]

Liss Athletic 3 Meon Milton 2

After only a minute an error by the Meon keeper fell to a Liss player who shot over the bar. The same thing happened after 9 minutes but this time Nathan Lennox made no mistake and put Liss in front. On 26 minutes a good effort from Meon's Harry Keeler was tipped over the bar. Little to comment on for the rest of the half which was scrappy with neither side looking after the ball very well. HT 1-0.

At the start of the second a cross from the left was not cleared by Liss and Toby Appleby brought the score back to 1-1. On 65 there was a half chance to Liss following a good break down the right, but the effort on goal was well saved. On 72 minutes a good header from Keeler was well saved by the Liss keeper. Shortly after on 76 a cross from

the right was not cleared by Meon and Alfie McWilliams made no mistake to put the home side back in front.

The game looked as if was petering out, but on 90 minutes, following a Meon free kick. Keeler brought the score back to 2-2. Still not over, and on 95 minutes, a good move by Liss down the right gave McWilliams to get his second and a very late winner for Liss. Hook FC 3 Hedge End Rangers 1

Hook welcomed Hedge End Rangers in the league with both teams in great form going into the game. It was an end-to-end encounter for much of the game but it was the away side who found themselves ahead after 10 minutes through Gould who had a great start to the match. Hook responded instantly in the 11th minute when Roxburgh rolled his defender and chipped the goalie with a cultured finish. Only four minutes after that, Hedge End won themselves a penalty when the ball flicked up onto the arm of the Hook defender from a close distance, a decision where the referee couldn't win, Hook claimed it was the incorrect decision, but it could've been given either way. Hook thought justice was served when Goalkeeper Karl Lewis saved low to his left from the spot to keep the score level. Not long after that Lewis found himself coming off through injury which meant Hook ended up with defender Smith with the gloves on and a change of shape for the team. But Hook had turned it round by half time to lead 2-1.

Hook came out in the second half with more energy than the opposition and were creating some good chances but couldn't quite stay onside until the 58th minute through a great cross found Colson at the back stick to tap it home for 3-1. Hedge End tried to push forward for the rest of the half but couldn't break down a plucky Hook defence. [with thanks to Morgan Davis]
