A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas


*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

A couple of midweek games this time — on **Tuesday**, Liss Athletic travelled to high-flying Wessex Prem Petersfield Town and lost 2-3 in the Portsmouth Senior Cup. They reported: 'A great effort from the boys tonight, just falling short against a side riding high at Step 5, in a well contested and well supported local derby. Elliot Harrison (diving header) and Theo Glazier were our scorers'

On **Wednesday** Hedge End Rangers went out of the Southampton Senior Cup to Southampton League side Sporting Wessex on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

Saturday was dominated by cup games, with just three league games.

The **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** saw a variety of opposition for our teams. Despite the weather not being great nearer the weekend, most games took place.

Thankfully there were no trips to the IOW for our teams this time, but we had two home fixtures: Headley United had a great result against West Wight, currently top of their league, holding them to a 1-1 draw, and then winning on penalties. Andover Town had a good 4-1 win over Osborne Coburg in a battle of the two bottom teams in their respective divisions.

Athletic had an interesting matchup at home to Hart United from the Surrey County Intermediate League, the final score being an exciting 4-3 to the visitors. Liss came back from 1-3 down, thanks to two goals from sub Rosewarne, only to lose right at the end. Whitehill & Bordon also had an interesting game, against Bournemouth Electric, now doing well in the Dorset Premier League, and Bordon had a good 3-2 win at the Daly, two of those from McKay.

Sway had a tricky trip to Sporting Wessex of the Southampton League, who had already beaten BTC Southampton from our league this season. The result had not yet come in at publication time.

We had a number of our teams facing U23/Development sides, which as we've said before, are often unknown quantities.

Quite a few of the U23 matchups were either postponed or awarded to our teams. Clanfield featured twice in our list of opposition, and they lost both games convincingly to our teams: the Development team lost 0-5 at Broughton, and the Reserves lost 0-3 at home to AFC Shirley at Peel Park, scene of many an HPFL fixture. AFC Shirley saw it thus: 'A rampant Owls display saw us comfortably into the next round, and somehow it was only three!

We came flying out the blocks, dominating with over 70% possession. Barnes had the ball clearly over the line early on, but the linesman waved play on. Undeterred, we kept pushing, and after several chances, Kim arrived late to slot home his first goal for the club. Minutes later, it was two: Read beat three players, played a slick one-two with Mandigora, and slipped Brogan through to smash home.

The second half was much the same, total control, plenty of possession, and wave after wave of attack. The third came when Barnes whipped in a perfect cross for Brogan to head home his second of the day.

A brilliant all-round performance, building on last week's momentum.'

Twentyten had an excellent 3-0 home win over AFC Portchester Res. Bromley, Clarke and Dore were their scorers.

There were some all-HPFL matches, coincidentally all Senior Division v Division One teams

Senior Division high-fliers Crofton Saints played their first home game at Gosport, where they had a 5-0 win over Mob Albion, with Southon getting a hat-trick. Southsea Sports avoided an upset when they eased past Div 1 leaders Overton United 2-1 with a last-minute winner, Blofield and Hatherley their scorers. Southsea adverised that there was a programme for this match. Paulsgrove hosted Liphook United for the second time this season in a cup game, this time they lost 0-2, Crook and Davis on target for Liphook. Nursling & Shirley couldn't manage to create an upset, either, losing 0-3 at home to Hook.

We also had three league games: in the **Senior Division**, leaders Locks Heath lost 0-1 to a Hurst goal at home to Hedge End Rangers, who are now sixth, and Denmead lost 1-4 at home to Bishops Waltham Dynamos, who gained their first win in ten games. B.Steele got two for Dynamos, one a penalty.

In **Division One** Hedge End Town went fifth as they beat Rushmoor Community with two very late goals, the winner in injury time from Swift.

Match Reports

Hedge End Town 2 Rushmoor Community 1

Miserable day at Hedge End with more heavy rain forecast.

On six minutes a good cross from the right was met by Rushmoor's Connor Morris who forced a good save by Bessant in the Hedge End goal. Almost immediately afterwards, a ball from Rushmoor found its way to Jacob Chadd on the 18-yard line who made no mistake givng the visitors the lead. It then became somewhat akin to watching a malfunctioning pinball machine, and there were few opportunities to increase the score. But on 32 minutes what looked like a certain penalty for Hedge End was turned into a free kick. Torrential rain followed leading up to half time, with the score still at 0-1.



At the start of the second half Hedge End started quite well with Adam Smith pushed up front, they gained a couple of corners but with no result. Still a very scrappy game. On 78 minutes a shot from Hedge End Town's Williams was just wide of the goal. On 88 minutes following a long clearance from Hedge End Town, the ball dropped to Austin Grigg who got off a good shot which went in despite the keeper getting a hand to it, the scores were level. A frenetic added time period followed, with several opportunities for both sides, and on 93 minutes neat play from Hedge End the ball found itself to Swift who did well in the 18-yard box to get a shot off to net the winner and earn Hedge End the three points. Nursling & Shirley 0 Hook 3

Nursling and Shirley hosted Hook FC in the Hampshire Saturday Trophy this weekend. The home side are currently sitting at 4th in their league and Hook are in 3rd in the league above.
