A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs


Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

No midweek games this week, and again we had all league games at the weekend except for one. Despite a lot of rain during the week and on Satuday we only had three games called off due to the weather.

The cup game was a big one, the first round 3 fixture in the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy.** In a repeat of last season's quarter-final, Crofton Saints beat Locks Heath, this time in normal time. This time the score was 2-0, and the venue was Saints' new home at Gosport Borough. Goals from Burns and Stanley in the second half settled it.

In the **Senior Division**, there were four games played, unusually two of them were goalless draws. One of these was in the local derby between Whitehill & Bordon and Liphook United, and the other was at Broughton, where the visitors were Hedge End Rangers. Rangers dropped a place to seventh after Denmead's excellent 3-0 win at Meon Milton enabled them to end a winless run of five games. Matare, Stafford and Jewell were on target for the Mead. The one game with a few goals in it was Bishops Waltham Dynamos' 4-2 win over fifth-placed Liss Athletic at Mountbatten.

In **Division One**, we had five games. The top two were not in action, but Silchester Village were unable to close the gap to them as they were beaten 3-4 in an exciting game at Rushmoor Community. Manyani got the winner in injury time. BTC are still fourth, but now level on points with a game in hand on Silchester after an excellent 5-2 home win over Nursling & Shirley, who drop to fifth. Further down the table, there were important home wins for Sway, 3-2 over Twentyten, whom they now overtake, and Whiteley Wanderers, surprise 3-0 winners over sixth-placed Hedge End Town, their second win in a row. Mid-table Hayling United recorded a 3-1 victory at bottom club Paulsgrove, with three late goals from Salami, Humphreys and Clark.

Match Report

Hampshire Saturday Trophy Round 3

Crofton Saints 2 Locks Heath 0

I saw the same fixture last season at Broookfield School 4G in the Quarter-Final of this competition and it was an awful game full of moans and fouls with little goal action, with Div 1 Crofton winning on penalties and losing in the final. This time Crofton sat proudly atop the Senior Division and are now groundsharing at Gosport Borough, showing their ambition. They had won their first three home games at the AEI, scoring 15 goals in the process, so they clearly like it there. Locks were one of the title favourites but have been sidetracked recently with cup games, and this was their fifth away game in a row. They conceded five in defeat at AFC Shirley last weekend, so had something to prove against a local rival today.

In the event this was a better game then last year; only for about 10-15 mins did it threaten to go the same way as then, but after a pretty even first half, the hosts came out strongly at the start of the second, and had the game won by the hour mark, thanks to two deflections and a sending-off for Locks' Ramsay.

An early header by Ayling for Saints was saved by Johns, and at the other end a clearance by Lavin fell straight to Joe Davis, who returned it goalwards, but was wide. Locks had a fair amount of possession at this point but only A.Clark's hooked effort, providing an easy save for Lavin, to show for it. A free-kick was then cleared to Southon for the hosts, who volleyed over. We then started to get the fouls and moaning but as soon as the ref showed a yellow card, the teams concentrated more on the football. And it soon became more entertaining: Stanley had a shot wide for the homesters, and Johnson for the visitors forced Lavin into two saves from shots from outside the area, the second one a pretty good one. Johns then had a free-kick from Burns to save, and Crofton's H.Clark had a long shot over. A good ball then saw Southon through, but Johns denied him with a good save. A great ball then put Stanley in on the right and this time he beat Johns but Ramsay made a good clearance off the line. Minor efforts from either team went wide before the break, HT 0-0.



The home side went up a gear at the start of the second half, and Bowden had an early shot over, On 47 mins a corner saw a scramble, the ball came to Burns whose shot was deflected, enough to beat the diving Johns. Bowden headed a free-kick over before Saints doubled their lead on 56 mins, a free-kick by Broadway was deflected onto the post and Stanley followed up to score. Locks were under pressure and on 62 mins a free-kick was given against them just outside the area. Ramsay was not happy and talked his way into one yellow card, then into a second. With ten men it was a long way back for Locks. To their credit they kept trying to play and create chances, but their opponents continued to battle hard to deny them anything, while continuing to look dangerous themselves. A Broadway free-kick whistled past the angle, an attack down the left saw Southon shoot wide, and a Steel free-kick went over. As we approached the end Locks had one good chance, a nice move saw a cross from the right find A.Clark in space, but he shot straight at Lavin. At the other end Bowman headed over but it was Saints' day and they march on. [Paul H]
