POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - **across any competition** - it is the clubs' responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (alan.gower2@ntlworld.com) and League Secretary (paulcrocker71@gmail.com) - as soon as possible.

Clubs **MUST** contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

Important reminders from the League Secretary

The home club should pay the referee's fee before or immediately after the game, not later than 8pm on the day of the match.

All clubs need to update players' suspensions following matches to ensure they do not remain showing as suspended.

Contact from clubs to the League must be made by the Club Secretary to the League Secretary.

Please check that the level of insurance you and your players have taken out meets all your needs.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

***Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.**

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

Round-Up

The Christmas/New Year period saw a few league games played on the Saturday before Christmas, then, to start the New Year, some of our teams were in action in the next round of the Hampshire Saturday Trophy plus there were a couple of games in the Senior Division.

Firstly, the **pre-Christmas** league games:

In the **Senior Division**, Locks Heath went into second after a 2-1 home win over Broughton, Bosworth with the important goal. Hedge End Rangers' 3-2 win (Bickley scored two for Rangers) over Meon Milton moved them up to be level with sixth-placed Liss Athletic, who lost 2-3 at in-form Moneyfields Res, for whom Cole scored two. The bottom two met with Stockbridge gaining a 2-1 victory at near-neighbours Andover Town, who remain bottom. Hutchings got the injury-time winner.

In **Division One**, it was as you were, as the top two, only separated by goal difference, both won. Leaders Overton United had a 2-1 home win over Whiteley Wanderers, who, despite their league position, had been in decent form recently. Wilson got a late winner for the home side. AFC Netley had a good 4-0 win at Hayling United (a double from Maurin), whose third home defeat in a row this was. Silchester Village moved back into third with a 2-1 win at Sway, who had also been in good form. Graves scored both goals for Silchester. BTC Southampton, in fifth, had a 1-0 win at bottom four side Mob Albion, the goal from Sousa.

The New Year saw cold temperatures and overnight frost, but we still had a few games on in the Hampshire Saturday Trophy, and a couple in the Senior Division.

Three of our sides are through to the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** quarter finals; Hedge End Rangers had a good 4-0 home win over Surrey Intermediate side Hart United, two of the four from Colwill, AFC Shirley won 6-0 at Meon Milton Reserves (an Ormiston hat-trick and a Brogan double doing most of the damage), and Crofton Saints had a 3-0 home win over U.S. Portsmouth Reserves, two of those from Southon. The only side who fell short were AFC Netley who lost 3-4 to Ringwood Town Dev/U21, despite two goals from Prendergast.

In the **Senior Division**, two games saw Stockbridge rise to fourth-bottom after an excellent 1-0 home win over Liss Athletic, and Moneyfields Res continued their good run with a superb 4-0 win at fifth-placed Denmead to move above Liss into sixth.

Match Report

Hampshire Saturday Trophy Round 4

Hedge End Rangers 4 Hart United 0 @Sholing

Good performance and result for Rangers against opposition who had already beaten HPFL opposition twice in this competition, and who had won the Aldershot League with a 100% record last year before joining the Surrey Intermediate this season.

It was a competitive match throughout, well refereed, and although the visitors battled well, the hosts made most of the chances, and their finishing was pretty good. An early shot by Gould was pushed away by visiting keeper Cunningham, Braggington then came close with a couple of shots from distance. A good move also saw Bell's shot well blocked before Rangers took the lead on 37 mins. A long ball completely caught out the Hart defence and two home players were free, Hurst

slotting home. The visitors came back and a free-kick saw Nwanua's header saved by Downs. The hosts had a couple more efforts before the break, Bickley and Hurst going close. HT 1-0.



The home side were more on top after the break and Gould had a shout for a penalty as he appeared to be bundled over following a cross from the left, nothing given. Gould then had another attempt, firing just over. But his team doubled their lead on 54 mins as Colwill (brother of Chelsea player Levi), followed up on a clearance and found the net with a good shot. The visitors had a better spell after this; a shot was blocked, and a good cross just eluded Joseph. At the other end a good cross by Colwill saw Hurst head wide at the far post, and Gould had an effort over. Hart then had a couple more shots, but Dansie and Joseph were off target. A scramble in the home area then saw sub Diarra head onto the crossbar, the ball then going over. But on 82 mins the hosts made the game safe as Colwill again pounced with a nice shot from the right of the area. The home side looked for more, sub Nichols forced a good save from Cunningham, Gould forced an even better save as the ball was tipped onto the post, but deep into injury time Rangers had an overload of players in the area and Gould struck the fourth.

An impressive victory for Rangers, who reach the quarter-final, but they will also be looking at their league form, having applied to the Wessex and lying seventh, they still have a bit of work to do. Based on this performance, they have every chance.[Paul H]
