POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - **across any competition** - it is the clubs' responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (alan.gower2@ntlworld.com) and League Secretary (paulcrocker71@gmail.com) - as soon as possible.

Clubs **MUST** contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

Important reminders

The home club should pay the referee's fee before or immediately after the game, not later than 8pm on the day of the match.

All clubs need to update players' suspensions following matches to ensure they do not remain showing as suspended.

Contact from clubs to the League must be made by the Club Secretary to the League Secretary.

Insurance – please read

Please check that the level of insurance you and your players have taken out meets all your needs.

We have had a bad recent player injury in our league and discovered limitations with the Intermediate Level in case of something more serious.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

Round-Up

In **midweek** we had one cup game - Locks Heath had a superb 3-0 win at Wessex Div 1 side US Portsmouth. Groundhopper George125 saw it this way:

'Locks Heath took the lead on the half hour when the goalkeeper came out to try and clear but it fell to Rogers who volleyed it over the goalie and into the net from 30 yards. It would take until just over twenty minutes to go for them to double their lead when Clark chested it down and stabbed it past the goalie before Davis sealed the win six minutes later to set up another cup game against Stoneham.'

Another very wet week led to a few postponements at the weekend, but we were still left with a few league games in each division, and a couple of cup ties.

In the **Senior Division**, the only team in the top three to play was Locks Heath, and they took advantage after moving their game to Front Lawn by winning 3-1, with goals by Simpson, Davis and Johnson, and going to the top of the table. Hook missed their chance to go second as they lost 0-3 at Hedge End Rangers, whose third win in a row takes them into sixth. Bottom five sides Meon Milton and Southsea Sports both had home draws – Meon drew 1-1 with Broughton, thanks to an Easen goal, to move up a place, and Southsea drew 3-3 with Denmead.

In **Division One**, BTC Southampton were the only team in the top five to play a league game, and they took advantage of this by winning 2-0 at Rushmoor Community, whom they had beaten 3-0 at home last week, to move into third. Further down the table, Whiteley Wanderers continued their good run (four home wins in a row) by beating Hayling United 2-1 at home, and as a result they move above their opponents into ninth. The bottom two met, and Headley United won 3-1 at Paulsgrove to move three points clear of them. Headley also have several games in hand on those above them.

In the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy**, a local derby saw Whitehill & Bordon beat the reinstated Liphook United 3-0 at the Daly (Warren, Black and an own goal), and they now travel to Crofton Saints in the quarter final.

In the **North Hants Intermediate Cup** there were wins for both our teams: Twentyten had a 4-1 home win over Amesbury Town Res, helped by a Worsfold hat-trick, but Silchester Village needed penalties to beat Bramley Town U23s.
