POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - **across any competition** - it is the clubs' responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (alan.gower2@ntlworld.com) and League Secretary (paulcrocker71@gmail.com) - as soon as possible.

Clubs **MUST** contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

Important reminders

The home club should pay the referee's fee before or immediately after the game, not later than 8pm on the day of the match.

All clubs need to update players' suspensions following matches to ensure they do not remain showing as suspended.

Contact from clubs to the League must be made by the Club Secretary to the League Secretary.

Please check that the level of insurance you and your players have taken out meets all your needs.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

Rain put paid to all our midweek matches.

At the weekend, despite the continuing wet weather, only three matches were called off.

Cup games first, and in the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy**, a much-postponed fourth round match saw disappointment for Andover Town, who went out on penalties to Southampton League Follands Sports 'A' after a 1-1 draw.

We also had the remaining quarter-final match in the **uhlsport League Cup**, which saw a match between the second placed teams in each division and in the end it was home side Crofton Saints of the Senior Division coming out on top, 1-0 against Division 1 team AFC Netley to set up a trip to Locks Heath in the semi-finals. Burns got the winner for Crofton.

In another quarter-final, the **George Mason Memorial Shield** saw an all Division 1 game, in which third-top BTC Southampton beat third-bottom Twentyten 5-0. BTC now face a trip to Mob Albion in the semis.

In the **Senior Division**, the only team in the top three to play this weekend was AFC Shirley, who stay third after a 0-2 defeat at fifth-bottom Southsea Sports. Moneyfields Reserves' great run continues, a 2-1 home win over Whitehill & Bordon pushes them into the top four after their fifth win in a row. Cole and Ewens were on target for Moneys. Seventh-placed Liss Athletic won 2-0 at fourth-bottom Meon Milton, their first win in eight league and cup games. Ankers and Butler scored for Liss. Broughton beat Stockbridge 3-1 in a local derby in front of nearly a hundred spectators.

In **Division One**, with Netley in cup action, Overton United beat in-form Sway 1-0, the only goal from Hargood, to open up a three-point lead at the top of the table. Hedge End went third with a 3-1 home win over fifth-placed Silchester Village. The bottom two met again and Headley United added a 6-0 home win (two goals from Hickey) this weekend to add to last weekend's 3-1 away win against the same opponents, Paulsgrove, who are now marooned at the bottom. Mob Albion drop into the bottom two after a 3-4 home defeat by Whiteley Wanderers, which saw the visitors move into seventh after five wins in their last six games.

Match Reports

Crofton Saints 1 AFC Netley 0

The game started at a fast pace and never slowed down - both sides attacking, a full blooded cup tie. The referee was quick to show the yellow cards and frequently found himself surrounded by protesting players . Very few chances falling to either side. Feisty throughout but at half time it was 0-0.



The second half resumed in similar fashion and the breakthrough came on 50 minutes when Burns managed to scramble the ball in from an untidy passage of play in the Netley 18-yard box. The game continued in the same way with frequent bookings and the occasional melee one of which resulted in a Netley red card . There were a couple of half chances for Netley but were wasted - the tempo of the game continued right up to the final whistle [Paul C].

Broughton 3 Stockbridge 1

Broughton came into the first home local league derby vs Stockbridge in 25 years on the back of a good start to 2026, with four points from two games.

A strong start to the game saw Billy Brindley score a easy free kick for Broughton to go 1-0 up, some confusion in the Ton back line then saw Stockbridge awarded a penalty. which was dispatched with aplomb to make it 1-1 at HT.

Some strong words at halftime saw the Ton come out strongly, a early penalty was awarded, but credit to the Stockbridge keeper who saved the weak effort well.

Despair turned to delight as Ben Allen squared across the box for Mumford to connect unbelievably at full speed to fire Broughton in front, 2-1.

To add to the drama, on 60 minutes, Broughton went down to 10 men after a very poor challenge from Josh Bishop.

Despite the numerical advantage, Stockbridge offered very little, and Broughton dominated the rest of the game, helped by the Stockbridge keeper punching a Brindley set piece into his own net.

Three unbeaten so far this year from Broughton and completing the double over our local rivals with a dominating performance to the delight of the big crowd in attendance.

Broughton 3 Stockbridge 1

Feisty local derby between near neighbours in the same division for the first time in 30 seasons, although I suspect they have met in cup competitions and pre-season friendlies in the intervening years.

The hosts took the lead in the 7th minute with a superb free kick from the left edge of the penalty area by Brindley, bending it round the wall into the top corner of the net.

Visitors levelled just shy of the 30 minute mark when they were awarded a penalty which was smashed into the top corner past the keeper's left.



Early in the second half the hosts were awarded a penalty but it wasn't the best of strikes with the keeper diving low to his right to make an easy save, but two minutes later the hosts were ahead when Mumford met a low cross from the right with a first time strike into the roof of the net. On the hour the hosts were reduced to 10 men when their #3 was sent off for a rash challenge, but the visitors couldn't make their man advantage count and it was the hosts who scored again on 75 minutes when the visiting keeper punched an inswinging corner into his own net.
