The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

## Important reminders

The home club should pay the referee's fee before or immediately after the game, not later than 8pm on the day of the match.

All clubs need to update players' suspensions following matches to ensure they do not remain showing as suspended.

Contact from clubs to the League must be made by the Club Secretary to the League Secretary.

## **A polite reminder...**

**...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.**

### **Pitch Surrounds**

**All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.**

### **Spectators at 3G venues**

**Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.**

### **Technical Areas**

**\*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.**

### **Dug Outs**

**Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.**

### **Small Sided Goals**

**Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.**

## **Round-Up**

After the only game in midweek was postponed, we hoped for better weather at the weekend.

However, this was not to be, and all games on grass were postponed.

However, no fewer than eight matches took place on 3/4G, some already planned, some moved late, so we had some action to report on in both divisions.

The Hampshire Saturday Trophy game at AFC Shirley was called off.

The **Senior Division** saw three matches. The North Hampshire derby saw Whitehill & Bordon defeat Liss Athletic 4-1 to move level on points with them in eighth, with a game in hand. Hunter, Worman, Davis and Warren got the goals for the winners. Hedge End Rangers got an injury-time winner from Bell to beat Denmead 3-2 to move level on points with fifth-placed Hook in a game with three red cards. Bishops Waltham Dynamos played their first game of the year, a 2-0 win over second-bottom Liphook United, with goals by Yeadon and Gillooly.

In **Division One**, five games were played. The top two both won, Overton United's 1-0 victory at Hayling United, thanks to a Hargood penalty, keeps them three points clear of AFC Netley (3-0 winners over Rushmoor Community), who have a game in hand. BTC had an impressive 9-0 win at bottom team Paulsgrove to move into third with games in hand on the top two. BTC haven't conceded a goal in five games now. Headley United moved up to fifth-bottom after a 5-4 win over in-form Whiteley Wanderers, and Twentyten moved four points clear of the bottom two after a good 3-2 home win over Sway. Worsfold, Osaborne and Tyson were on target for the home team.

## Match Reports

### Hedge End Rangers 3 Denmead 2

Where to go on a day when all the grass pitches are washed out and I didn't want to drive too far? So I settle on my third visit to Hedge End Rangers at Sholing. Stay dry and get tea, what's not to like.

First few minutes it was a very even contest but on 10 minutes a ball from HER from the right fell to a lurking Jamie White to make it 1-0.

On 18 minutes an escape for HER when a cross from Denmead flashes passes the goal with no one to take advantage. On 30 minutes a corner from Denmead was met with a header, just wide. 40 minutes saw the start of the cards, beginning with HER's Bragginton getting a red for lashing out with his foot after winning a free kick.

Right on the stroke of half time Denmead were awarded a goal after an untidy scramble in the six-yard box following what I thought was a foul on the HER centre half and another on the keeper but it was given.

Denmead started the second half in lively fashion but lost Adekoya to a sin bin on 55 minutes so it was 10 v 10 now. HER looked nervous and uncomfortable in the next few minutes. On 69 minutes Knight of Denmead was also sent to the sin bin. On 76 minutes a free kick for HER from about 25 yards was misjudged by the Denmead keeper and poacher White was on hand to score his second of the afternoon to give his side the lead again. Plenty of action followed and on 85 minutes Mr Miles awarded a free kick to Denmead just outside the D which was duly curled in by Adekoya for 2-2 and game on !! Another red, for Barnden of Denmead this time, for a similar incident to the previous red. Yellows were appearing like a field of daffodils. Well into injury time, on 98 minutes, a good cross from the right hand by HER found Bell to make it 3-2 to HER and a dramatic victory.

7 Yellows and 3 reds, one awarded after the final whistle to a Denmead player.

Not a dirty game but certainly one lacking discipline from both teams.

HER will be relieved to add 3 points to their total.

### **AFC Netley 3 Rushmoor Community 0**

With the late KO at Eastleigh and everything on grass within reach being off, I settled for this one on the way to the Silverlake.

Netley are three points behind Overton at the top with a game in hand. I saw their draw with Overton three weeks ago. They had won seven straight league games before that. The visitors are solidly mid-table although they had lost their last three coming into this. In the event the home side were on top throughout although they struggled to overcome a battling away side and their high defensive line. This even applied when Rushmoor were down to 10 men (through injury) for the last 25 mins. It took three good efforts to beat them.

The home side started well and applied pressure on their opponents from the start. Both full backs were involved: Page had a shot blocked then a cross from Chivers drifted just over. After that the visitors came into the game but couldn't make much headway against a solid defence also playing a high line. Higby threatened down the left, one cross was just missed by Maurin, another one again fell to Maurin but Hone made a good save. The hosts were trying beat the offside trap and got through leaving Chivers with a chance but he shot wide, Hone had to make another save then got caught out of his goal after a mix up but the attempt went just wide. On 41 mins the home side at last took the lead as Maurin timed his run perfectly to beat the offside on halfway, then ran on and a lovely chip beat Hone. Maurin had another chance just on the break after a free-kick but he shot wide. HT 1-0.



Same pattern after the break, Higby fired wide then forced Hone to save well with his legs after a defensive error. Hone then had to beat an effort from Schmedlin away and save another Higby shot as he cut in from the left. The important second goal came on the hour as Nicholas picked up the ball on the right, he moved infield, beat a couple of defenders and finished well. Hone made another save before his team went down to ten men on 65 mins as Glanville picked up a knee injury and they had used all their subs. Still they battled away and the home team were running out of ideas. Hone made an easy save from Prendergast before the visitors had their one chance as Gray, who worked

hard up front all game, at last broke through but he was denied by a good block by Sayers. On 86 mins Netley got a third as Nicholas again picked the ball up on the right, ran at the defence and hammered a 30-yard shot past Hone.
