POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - **across any competition** - it is the clubs' responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (alan.gower2@ntlworld.com) and League Secretary (paulcrocker71@gmail.com) - as soon as possible.

Clubs **MUST** contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

Important reminders

The home club should pay the referee's fee before or immediately after the game, not later than 8pm on the day of the match.

All clubs need to update players' suspensions following matches to ensure they do not remain showing as suspended.

Contact from clubs to the League must be made by the Club Secretary to the League Secretary.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

*Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

Round-Up

Similar to last week.... after the only game in midweek was postponed, we hoped for better weather at the weekend.

Despite a sunny day on Saturday, it was still very wet, and we had three postponements, but most league games were able to take place. This was mainly due to no fewer than ten of the twelve matches being played on 3/4G.

The **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** game saw another of our teams in action; AFC Shirley exited the competition at the quarter final stage as they were held 0-0 by Surrey Intermediate side Hart United and then lost on penalties. This means that last season's finalists Crofton Saints are our sole side left in the competition this year.

The **Senior Division** saw Locks Heath extend their lead at the top to four points, thanks to an excellent 1-0 win at Moneyfields Res, who had risen to fourth after five wins in a row. McNulty headed the winner early on. Crofton Saints, in second, were held to a 1-1 home draw by Whitehill & Bordon. Ryman got the goal for Crofton, Davis was on target for the Stags, who played 75 minutes with ten men. With AFC Shirley in cup action, Hook moved into third after a 4-2 win over Liss Athletic, whose poor form continues (this was played at the Robert May's School in Odiham, and attracted a few grandhoppers), and Hedge End Rangers are now fourth after a 4-2 win at second-bottom Liphook United, who moved the game to Deer Park. Denmead moved back to withing striking distance of the top six with a 6-3 win at last-placed Andover Town, and Broughton are now unbeaten in five after a good 5-3 win at Southsea Sports. Bishops Waltham Dynamos beat Meon Milton 1-0 to gain their fourth home win in a row.

In **Division One**, Overton United took advantage of nearest rivals AFC Netley's postponement to go six points clear at the top with a 6-2 win at second-bottom Mob Albion. Hargood got a hat-trick for Overton and Martin got two. They meet again at Overton next week. The only other team in the top five to play were Silchester Village, who had a 2-0 win over Twentyten after switching their game to Tadley. Bardell and George got the goals in front of a decent crowd. Whiteley Wanderers, in sixth, continued their good form with a 6-2 home win over Rushmoor Community, who lost at Oasis Mayfield for the second successive week (last week to Netley). Another high-scoring game saw Hayling United gain their first win in five after a 4-3 home win over Headley United, who had just won three in a row. Clark got two for the Humbugs and sub Aldridge a late winner.

Match Report

Hampshire Saturday Trophy Quarter-Final

AFC Shirley 0 Hart United 0 (2-3 pens) @ Test Park 3G

The game was 'cagey' (with no subtle 3G cage pun intended) and a little as would be expected between two teams who knew very little about each other. Deakin posed a threat to the Owls, setting up Burrows who fired over and home keeper Wild had to be out sharply as Deakin attempted to latch onto a long ball. Shirley came the closest in the half, Mackie heading off the post from close range at the back stick from an Ormiston corner. Hart thought they'd netted right on the interval mark but Deakin's header was ruled out by the offside flag. HT: 0-0.



Kim came close for the Owls early in the second half and a promising move saw Brogan find Kim but Hart defender Nwanua covered well whilst Burrows also did well to thwart Kim. Hunt got forward, playing a wall pass with Brogan but again Nwanua read the situation well and cleared. Joseph worked a good position for Hart but Richardson, a solid defender in the Owls ranks, got in a fine tackle. When Ormiston broke the defensive line, Cunningham was down to thwart the attack. It was looking like penalties but there were late attempts by both sides, Mackie shooting over for Shirley and a passing move for Hart saw Nemorin source Deakin but, perhaps summing up Hart offensively today, his ball in the box didn't find a teammate and Wild held. Two strong defences were generally on top with little pickings for the front men and midfielders battled it out with little given. FT: 0-0.

Hart were firmly in the penalties driving seat scoring their opening two whilst Cunningham saved the Owls first two kicks, a great save from the first to acrobatically push the ball against the bar. The second one was too straight, as was Gana's for Hart and Nemorin's kick thumped off the crossbar. Callaway and Wood pulled Shirley back with fine spot-kicks. Breau's kick ... well, it went in ... somehow, another that was too straight but the ball spun from Wild's grasp and continued into goal. Brooks' corner bound kick was saved at full stretch to his right by Cunningham to put the 'Purple and Golds' into the semi-final stage.
