Round-Up

We had a couple of **midweek** games before Easter, one cup match and one league match.

Stockbridge travelled to Wessex Prem Andover New Street in their **North Hants Senior Cup** semi-final and put in an excellent performance, eventually losing 0-2.

In the **Senior Division**, leaders Locks Heath went five points clear as they had a 3-1 home win over a dogged Southsea Sports. Ramsay got two of the Locks goals.

Easter Saturday saw five league games scheduled in each division.

In the **Senior Division**, Hedge End Rangers moved back to within two points of Locks Heath (but have played four games more) after a 2-0 home won over AFC Shirley, who have slipped to ninth after five defeats in a row. Both McLeans, Harvey and Sanchez, were on target for Rangers. It was a good day for the top two as third-placed Hook lost 0-3 at Moneyfields Res (for whom Cole scored two), fourth-placed Crofton Saints lost 0-2 at home to Denmead, Jenkinson and Sarr on target for the Mead, and fifth-placed

Whitehill & Bordon draw 1-1 at bottom club Andover Town, who extended their unbeaten run to five, including four draws. Davis gave the Stags the lead but the Blues equalised right at the end. Liphook United had a good 2-0 win at Broughton, Knight and House with the goals, which puts them four points clear of the bottom two.

In **Division One**, AFC Netley are now level at the top with long-time leaders Overton United, with a game in hand, after an excellent 2-1 win at fourth-placed Silchester Village, thanks to an early goal from White and a late winner from Cherry. Other teams below them could only draw away at teams in the bottom four; BTC Southampton, in third, went down to ten men but got a 2-2 at Sway, and Hedge End Town, in fifth, got a 3-3 at Twentyten. Twentyten were 0-3 down at half time but goals from Osborne, Saunders and a late equaliser from Worsfold made for a great recovery. Another 3-3 saw Nursling & Shirley's first draw of the season, at home to Headley United. Further down the table, second-last Mob Albion celebrated their first league win since late October, 2-1 at Hayling United, a team they had lost 3-8 to in the reverse fixture.

There were a further nine league games scheduled for **Easter Monday**.

In the **Senior Division**, Bell's goal saw second-placed Hedge End Rangers to a narrow 1-0 home win over Bishops Waltham Dynamos, and third-placed Hook had an excellent 4-2 win at fifth-placed Whitehill & Bordon to end their good run. Crofton Saints, in fourth, suffered their third successive defeat, 0-3 at home to AFC Shirley, who ended their poor run.

AFC Shirley described it thus:

'Back to winning ways in emphatic fashion against a strong Crofton side. A solid first half performance saw us take the lead through a superb finish from Harry Vidler, giving us a deserved advantage at the break. We started the second half brightly, but the hosts almost equalised, only to be brilliantly denied by Dylan Wild, pulling off a top save from close range. The second goal was something special. Craig Hunt won the ball high up the pitch, spotted the keeper off his line, and produced an outrageous finish from halfway to We sealed it with another moment of quality, as Jordan Brooks beat two defenders before smashing a left footed strike into the top corner to double our lead.

A fantastic all-round performance and a great result after the break in fixtures.'

Meon Milton exacted some revenge over bottom club Andover Town for last week's defeat with a 5-1 win at the Cockleshell. Mitchell got two for Meon. Liss Athletic picked up a useful 1-1 draw at sixth-placed Denmead (Jewell scored for the Mead, Dyer for Liss), and in a bottom five clash, it finished 2-2 between Stockbridge and Southsea Sports. Hutchings and Plowman got the Robins' goals, Blofield scored both for Southsea.

In **Division One**, the top two both won again, so Overton United are still ahead of AFC Netley, who have a game in hand, on goal difference. Overton had an excellent 3-1 victory at third place BTC Southampton, Hargood scoring two of them, and Netley beat Nursling & Shirley 4-1 at home, Greenough notching a double.

Match Reports

Locks Heath 3 Southsea Sports 1

A Thursday night game at Locks Rec (and there's another one next week) as the home team were looking to extend their two-point lead at the top of the table; they have games in hand over most of their nearest challengers, and they reached the League Cup final last weekend, so it's been a good season so far.

My first time seeing their opponents under the new name, Southsea Sports (previously Harvest(Home)). They have not had the best of seasons but four wins in their last eight games have propelled them well clear of the bottom four.

Locks had won both a league and a cup game at Southsea 4-2 earlier in the season but this was a closer game, where Locks were made to work hard for their victory, and, with better finishing, Southsea may have got something out of it.

The ball was passed back to the home side's Stream from kick-off and he tried a shot from his own half but Burchell in the away goal was alert to it. A ball over the top then saw the hosts' Bosworth unable to get enough height on his lob to beat Burchell. A great cross from the right by Ramsay then saw two Locks forwards unable to get a touch. At the other end a long ball saw fantastic control by Southsea's Kirby but with a clear shot on goal he screwed wide. After this frantic beginning the home side took the lead on 10 mins as Clark beat Burchall with a good cross-shot from the right, the ball going in off the far post. The visitors came back with a Vickers effort, saved. The game then became

tighter as both teams battled in midfield. Just past the half hour the visitors had another great chance as a break on the right saw the ball passed inside with time for Blofield to line up the shot, but the ball was crashed over. Locks improved again near to the break and Wood curled a shot from 25 yards onto the bar. Clark then hit a free-kick wide so we ended up with HT 1-0.



It was tight again after the restart with the visitors having a slight advantage, but neither team created much. Karberry hit the side netting and Griffin headed a free-kick over as the visitors were unable to make it count. In contrast, on 73 mins, Locks went two up with a clinical piece of finishing by Ramsay, who picked the ball up on the left of the area this time and scored with a cross-shot. The visitors came back and Blofield hooked a cross over, he then headed the corner wide. At the other end a spectacular flying attempt by Locks sub Crowney was wide. That looked to be it but suddenly things started to happen: on 89 mins a shot was well saved by Johns but the rebound was turned into the net from the right by sub Vincent. The (club) linesman gave offside but after a discussion with the ref, a goal was given. As we entered injury time a Locks attack down the left saw the visiting defence convinced that the ball had gone out on the byeline; fatally they stopped playing, and the home side carried on, with Ramsay scoring again. There had always been a fair amount of dissent during the game but this incident sparked mass protests. Soon after this the Southsea manager received two yellow cards for making his opinion known. Right at the end an attempt by home sub Thorne flew over, but his side were soon able to celebrate victory and a very important three points.

Hedge End Rangers 2 AFC Shirley 0

Under a respectful and reflective atmosphere, Hedge End Rangers and AFC Shirley played out a competitive encounter that ultimately saw the hosts secure a hard-earned 2–0 victory.

Before a ball was kicked, both sides impeccably observed a minute's silence, wearing black armbands in tribute to the late Paul Crocker. The home club ensured the moment was fittingly marked, using the tannoy to bring the ground together in remembrance - a poignant start to the afternoon's proceedings.

When play got underway, the match quickly settled into an evenly contested affair. Rangers enjoyed a bright opening spell, seeing plenty of the ball without managing to truly test the Shirley defence. The visitors, however, soon found their rhythm and began to impose themselves, producing the first real moment of quality in the 15th minute. A loose clearance dropped invitingly outside the box and was struck low and fiercely through a crowd, forcing a sharp, reactive save from the Rangers goalkeeper, who did well to get across and turn the effort behind.

That moment proved to be a catalyst for Shirley, who grew in confidence and began to dictate the tempo. Their number eight was particularly influential down the right flank, repeatedly delivering dangerous balls into the area, though the final touch continued to elude them. Another promising opportunity arrived around the half-hour mark, as a well-

timed ball over the top caught Rangers momentarily exposed, only for the recovering defence to regroup admirably and throw bodies in the way of a goal-bound effort.

Having weathered that spell of pressure, Rangers struck with ruthless efficiency in the 37th minute. A quickly taken throw-in on halfway caught Shirley off guard, and a high press saw possession turned over in an instant. The hosts broke forward with pace and precision, and Harvey McLean applied the finishing touch with a composed strike to give Rangers the lead.

The closing stages of the half were not without controversy. A high challenge from a Shirley player in the 43rd minute sparked a heated exchange, though the referee ultimately deemed a yellow card sufficient. Then, deep into stoppage time, came an even bigger flashpoint. A long ball over the top saw the Shirley goalkeeper rush out, only to be beaten to it by the onrushing attacker, whom he subsequently brought down inside the area. A penalty was awarded, but in a dramatic twist, the goalkeeper redeemed himself by producing a fine save to keep the deficit at one.

HT 1-0

Both sides left the field at half-time with grievances — Rangers frustrated not to have doubled their advantage, and Shirley perhaps relieved to still be in the contest.

The second half continued in much the same vein, with neither side able to fully wrest control despite periods of promise. Rangers thought they had extended their lead in the 74th minute when Sanchez McLean capitalised on a goalkeeping error and found the net, only for celebrations to be cut short by a handball decision that drew vocal protests from the home bench.

Undeterred, Rangers continued to apply pressure and were rewarded a few minutes later with a goal showing quality teamwork. Jack Moteane drove forward from midfield and slipped a perfectly weighted pass into Sanchez, who showed excellent composure to round his defender before unselfishly squaring the ball back for Moteane to finish from close range — a move that epitomised the growing cohesion in the Rangers attack.

With time running out, Shirley threw everything forward in search of a way back into the game. Rangers' defence, however, stood firm under sustained pressure. A late free-kick just outside the box in the 89th minute offered a final glimmer of hope, but the effort sailed over the bar, summing up a frustrating afternoon for the visitors.

After a lengthy period of stoppage time, the referee's final whistle confirmed a deserved victory for Rangers — a performance built on resilience, clinical finishing, and defensive discipline. On balance, it was a result that reflected their ability to capitalise on key moments in an otherwise closely fought contest, securing both three valuable points and a well-earned clean sheet
