## Small Project Grants

The HPFL Committee has set aside a fund of £6,000 to assist HPFL clubs with ground improvements. The improvements must be the responsibility of the clubs and not a third party such as a Council or landlord.

To receive the grant, the club must remain in the League for the 2026/27 season. The grant will need to be repaid if the club withdraw during the 2026/27 season.

A maximum of £500 grant per project will be considered with the actual grant given not being more than 75% of the total project cost. For example, if a project has a total cost of £400 then if the application is successful, a grant of £300 would be given. If a project has a total cost of £800 then if the application is successful, the maximum grant of £500 would be given.

Applications detailing the work required together with a quotation showing the cost of the work are invited to be made by 31/05/26 to the HPFL sub-committee for small project grants who will select the most appropriate applications to utilise the fund. Only one grant per club will be given. Clubs must be in good standing, with all league debts fully settled.

The work will need to be completed before any payment is made. Clubs will need to advise the HPFL sub-committee once the work is completed. The payment will need to be made by the HPFL by 31/12/26. Members of the sub-committee cannot have any association with the clubs submitting the applications.

## **Round-Up**

The focus on **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> May** was on cup competitions, with our own Cup Final day; there was also another cup final for one of our teams; and we had four scheduled league games.

Our **Cup Final day** was at the ground of Baffins Milton Rovers and a good crowd again attended (over 300 by the afternoon). A printed programme was available.

We had two closely-contested games in which the winning team had to come back from a goal down.

In the morning, the **George Mason Memorial Shield** final was between two teams who have had contrasting fortunes this season, and in the end it was Andover Town, bottom of our Senior Division, who beat BTC, who finished third in Division 1, 2-1. BTC took an

early lead through Plunkett but a goal in each half by Parton turned it round to give the Blues the trophy.

The afternoon game saw the **uhlsport Hampshire Premier League Cup** saw AFC Shirley add to their excellent third place in their debut season in the Senior Division by winning the cup too as they beat this season's champions Locks Heath, and deny them a double. Locks took an early lead thanks to a Clark penalty, but Ormiston tied it up midway through the second half with another penalty, and the Owls went on to get the winner late on as Barnes converted a cross from the right.

The other cup final on Saturday was the **Aldershot Intermediate Cup** Final, and we saw Senior Division Whitehill & Bordon lifting the trophy for the second year in succession, as they beat Binfield Development 2-1. Worman scored both goals for the victors.

There were also four league games scheduled on Saturday, three actually being played. In the **Senior Division**, Liphook United drew 2-2 in front of a big home crowd with second-bottom Stockbridge to extend their recent run to one defeat in six, which took them clear of the bottom four. Knight and Eade scored for Liphook.

In **Division One**, Twentyten beat Hayling United 2-1, with first-half goals from Worsfold and Osborne, to clinch a creditable ninth spot. Seventh played eighth at the NormRod as Hedge End Town beat Headley United 3-1, two of them from Swift, to break a run of five defeats in a row and to move into sixth place, but Whiteley Wanderers could still overtake them if they win their final game next weekend.

The following **Tuesday** saw Crofton Saints play in the final of the prestigious **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** final against the Fareham Town Development team, who finished mid-table in the Hampshire Combination and Development League. Saints lost in the final last season but made up for it this year with a comfortable 3-0 win. It was a powerful display by Saints, whose scorers were Bowden, Ryman and Browdney. Added to their fourth place finish in the league, it's been another good season for them.

The final **Senior Division** game was also played on Tuesday; a local derby as Liss Athletic, unbeaten in five, hosted Whitehill & Bordon. Liss won 3-1 to clinch sixth spot, their third consecutive top six finish. Stanbridge and Glazier were on target for Liss, there was an own goal too.

The final games of the league season were on **Saturday May 16<sup>th</sup>**, where we finished the Division One programme with two matches; it was fourth v fifth as Nursling & Shirley beat Silchester Village 2-0, and Whiteley Wanderers moved into sixth with an entertaining 5-2 home win over third-placed BTC Southampton. Suleiman got two for Wanderers.

**Breaking news:** Broughton have been reinstated into the North Hants Senior Cup and will now play Wessex Prem side Andover New Street in the Final on 26<sup>th</sup> May.

## **Match Reports**

### **Hampshire Premier League Cup Finals Day @Baffins Milton Rovers.**

Both closely-contested, close games, the winners both coming from behind in each match to clinch victory.

## 1030 - George Mason Memorial Shield Andover Town 2 BTC Southampton 1

BTC began brightly and opened the scoring after only four minutes, Plunkett beating the offside trap and providing a good finish. The Blues came back and Parton, who was a thorn in BTC's side all afternoon, shot over the bar and then forced Wride into a good block. From the corner Lunness headed wide. A BTC shot was then not cleared and Mouldsdale's effort was saved by Redshaw. On 14 mins a cross from the right came all the way across to Parton, unmarked at the far post, and he stabbed in for the equaliser. BTC came back and Mouldsdale headed just over, and Redshaw then had to come out quickly to clear before Johnson. Both teams battled for advantage in midfield and the only other chance of the half was a headed by Johnson from a header, over, so it was HT 1-1.



After the restart the Blues started to find space behind the BTC back four, and looked more dangerous. The ball was won and Parton was set up for a shot, just wide. A through ball saw Johnson challenge and he, Wride, and a covering defender went down in a heap, luckily all were OK. BTC then had a decent shout for a penalty when Plunkett went down under a challenge from the keeper, but the ref was in a good position to decide it wasn't. On 64 mins excellent work on the right saw a cross which saw Parton get the better of two defenders and the keeper to bundle the ball in and give Andover the lead for the first time. The Blues continued to look strong and Trapwell headed over from a free-kick, Lunness had a header saved, and a great cross by Parton was just of the reach of Johnson. As BTC pressed for the equaliser, their opponents held firm, and should have wrapped the game up in injury time as a free-kick fell to Parton three yards out but he blasted over; he then had a powerful shot not far wide.

Some consolation for Andover after a disappointing league season, and this may be the encouragement they need to mount a comeback next year. BTC have had an excellent first season in Division 1 since coming in from the Southampton League, as well as reaching this final.

## 1400 - uhsport Hampshire Premier League Cup

### AFC Shirley 2 Locks Heath 1

Locks were champions after a consistent season, and they were looking to do the double here, as well as make up for three final defeats in this cup in the last four years. Shirley have had an excellent debut season at this level, finishing third. and came into this game on the back of eight successive wins.

Locks started well and C.Wood got clear down the left a couple of times in the first few minutes, but nobody could pick up on his crosses. Brogan had an early volley over the bar for the Owls. A long-distance free-kick by Hunt gave Locks keeper Johns a comfortable save. On 16 mins the ball wasn't cleared and Johnson was fouled in the area to give Locks a penalty, coolly converted by Clark to put them in front. Shirley came back and from a good move Mandigora shot wide. Brogan then forced a good save from Johns, the rebound being blocked. Around the half hour mark a good move saw a Brogan header destined for the top corner, but Johns made a great save to tip it over. Vidler then had a shot just wide. Near to the break a foul right in front of the benches sparked some anger from the Owls, but it eventually calmed down. In injury time Reed headed a free-kick just over for Shirley, so it was HT 0-1.

Soon after the restart Owls keeper Wild picked up a through ball and was clattered by Johnson. After treatment he was able to continue, but eventually had to come off halfway through the period. As the Owls pressed, Locks threatened on the break, Clark was through and tried to lob the keeper (still Wild at this time) but he stretched high and did well to deflect it. More Locks pressure saw a scramble at a corner with a couple of blocked shots. It was then the Owls' turn to apply some pressure and as the ball bounced around the area the ref spotted a handball and awarded a penalty. Ormiston took it and sent Johns the wrong way for the equaliser on 69 mins. Locks came back and a scramble following a free-kick saw the ball bundled in but the ref saw an infringement and disallowed it. On 82 mins a Shirley attack down the right saw a good cross by M.Wood and sub Barnes appeared from nowhere to tap the ball in to give them the lead. Locks tried hard to come back but the Owls battled well to deny them much, At the end Locks got a corner after a superb block by Richardson, everyone went up for it, the ball was cleared and Barnes went haring down the pitch with everyone in hot pursuit. Johns tried

to stop him but was unable to, but a covering defender did a great job in getting the block in and denying Barnes his second. The final whistle went and Shirley could celebrate a great season with their highest-ever league place and a cup win. Locks still had the consolation of the league trophy.

We had a minute's silence before each game to remember our league secretary Paul Crocker, who sadly passed away recently.

## Hampshire Saturday Trophy Final

### Crofton Saints 3 Fareham Town Development 0 @AFC Stoneham

Saints lost the final of this prestigious trophy last year to Tadley Calleva Res, but made up for it this year with a comfortable victory and a powerful performance, playing some decent football too.

Right from the start Saints looked as if they meant business, although the Creeksiders had the first attempt on goal as a cross from the right saw Hashimoto's shot saved by Lavin. Saints took the lead on 10 mins as Bowden cut in from the left and his powerful shot looked to get a deflection on the way into the net. Three times Fareham players ended up on the floor (a couple of yellow cards were shown) as Saints looked to drive home their advantage. And they doubled their lead on 23 mins as a corner was not cleared, several shots were blocked, but the final one went over the line, the goal given to Ryman. A good Crofton move then saw two shots blocked before Ryman spooned the rebound over. Ryman went close again and Bowden had a shot saved; a great cross from the right from Bowman then missed everybody. As we reached the break a shot by Hashimoto was saved by Lavin, so we ended up HT 2-0.

The second half saw Saints again on top but this time the Creeksiders competed better and there were fewer chances. A goalkeeper clearance hit Crofton's Watts as he challenged and the ball looped just over. There was then a red card for someone on the Fareham bench. On 64 mins Fareham's Fisher was unfortunately stretchered off after an injury, sportingly the Crofton players did the carrying. On 71 mins it was all over, the goal bore an uncanny resemblance to the first as this time Broadway ran down the left and his powerful shot got a deflection into the net. After this Saints relaxed and the Creeksiders had their best spell; Hashimoto had a shot over and sub Hobbs had a good effort which forced a decent save from Lavin. Right at the end a free-kick by Saints' captain Broadway

went wide, but soon his side could celebrate a cup win to add to a good fourth place in the HPFL Senior Division in their debut season at this level. Congatulations to them!

## **Whiteley Wanderers 5 BTC Southampton 2**

I much preferred watching some local live football today instead of this year's FA Cup final, so this fitted the bill nicely. Whiteley could move a place up into sixth if they won against third-placed BTC. The hosts hadn't played for a month whereas BTC had played a cup final last Saturday, and had won their last five league games.

And I'm sure this was a lot better entertainment than what was on show at Wembley... despite it being the last game for the season, both sides were fully committed and produced some good football and some excellent goals.

The visitors started well and an early Perkis shot was saved. Mouldsdale then burst through and forced a good save from Vickery, the rebound was cleared off the line. But it was the hosts who took the lead after seven mins as a long ball saw Wride block the shot, it wasn't cleared, and Joe Davis threaded the ball into an empty net from 25 yards. Back came BTC and after a bit of pressure, Mouldsdale hooked a shot wide, Rodrigues headed wide, and Brumwell came close with two good efforts. The equaliser finally came after 21 mins the ball was bouncing around and Palmer expertly hooked it over Vickery into the net. Wanderers retook the lead soon after the restart as Kerby-Dickinson powered a shot from distance past Wride, He had another shot just wide soon after. Again the visitors came back and Wiltshire curled a nice shot onto the post. A lucky rebound then saw the hosts' Jack Davis set up Suleiman whose shot was cleared off the line, Jack Davis' follow-up was just wide, As we approached the break Whiteley increased their lead further as a free-kick was not gathered by Wride and Suleman had an open net at his mercy.

The visitors might have felt hard done by with the score at the end of the first half but Wanderers looked the better side after the break. A curler from sub Miller-Evans was just wide of the angle, and Jack Davis headed a corner just wide, crashing into the post at the same time. At the other end Cook fired over for the visitors.
