A reminder - next Saturday.....

...is 2nd Nov – the clocks have gone back this weekend, and therefore Saturday games will normally start an hour earlier, 1400, from now.

Check Full Time, as usual, for individual kick-off times.

## A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

#### **Pitch Surrounds**

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

#### **Spectators at 3G venues**

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

#### **Technical Areas**

Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

#### **Dug Outs**

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

#### **Small Sided Goals**

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

# A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

# **Changing Rooms**

Please remember to show respect and to leave the changing rooms as you would like to find them after a match. We received several complaints already this season that rooms have been left dirty and even damaged.

#### **Round-Up**

In **midweek**, we had two of our teams taking part in the **Southampton Senior Cup**. Sway, out of form in the league, and who suffered a big defeat to Overton United in the cup last weekend, did well at Wessex Prem Hythe & Dibden but eventually lost 1-3. Stockbridge also exited the competition, losing 1-5 at Wessex One Romsey Town.

On **Saturday** we almost had a full league programme scheduled.

The only exception was an early **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** game, in which Whitehill & Bordon won 3-2 at Southampton Leaguers Winsor United Green, who had reached the final last season beating several HPFL teams on the way.

**Senior Division** leaders Locks Heath weren't in action, so eyes were on the teams just behind them. Liphook United, in second, had a tough-looking journey to Hook and so it proved, the home side winning 5-3, two of their goals from Saint-Vincent. Andover Town, in third, had won six games in a row in all competitions prior to their home game against Harvest, who had pulled away from the bottom following some good results. And the visitors continuing their upward trend, battling their way to a 1-1 draw despite another goal from Morgans for the hosts. This left Colden Common, 6-2 winners over Meon Milton in their first home game at the new Winchester City 4G facility, including a hattrick for Adekoya, to leapfrog these two to reach second place – a welcome return to form after three league defeats on the spin. However, the most bizarre result was at Stockbridge, where the inconsistent hosts, in fifth place, entertained eighth-placed Liss Athletic, who made it five wins in a row by the little matter of a 1-10 scoreline. New striking sensation Anelay got five of Liss' ten goals (he got five in the Aldershot Intermediate Cup recently as well), Stanbridge got two as well. Hedge End Rangers are now firmly mid-table after a good start to the season, and this weekend's 2-3 home loss to Denmead was the Mead's first win in four league games. Hammerton, Stafford and Ganyo were on target for the visitors. Paulsgrove are still bottom after a 0-7 home loss to Bishops Waltham Dynamos, and the battle of third-bottom v second bottom saw Sway win 4-3 at Moneyfields Res, despite an Austin hat-trick for Moneys, to move above their opponents. Sampson, Farndell, Greenough and Miles were on target for Sway.

In **Division 1** leaders Broughton lost their 100% record as they were surprisingly held 0-0 at Hayling United, who move out of the bottom two. They retain their four point lead as second-placed Crofton Saints drew 2-2 at Silchester (Hart got both of their goals) and Upham, in third, lost 3-4 at Hedge End Town, who now join them and Overton United on 20 points. Rushmoor Community had a good 4-2 home win over fellow new boys Mob Albion to remain sixth. Hedley, for the home side, and Kaberry, for the visitors, both scored twice. Nearer the bottom, AFC Netley had a good 3-1 home win over Whiteley Wanderers to put an end to their poor recent run — Netley's scorers Rushent, Cherry and Page - and the battle of the bottom two at Winklebury saw Twentyten beat QK Southampton 3-1 and send their opponents down into last place.
