
HPFL Club of the Month Award

POSTPONEMENTS

A reminder that if your match is postponed - across <u>any</u> competition - it is the clubs responsibility to inform the League Fixtures Secretary (<u>alan.gower2@ntlworld.com</u>) and <u>League Secretary</u> (<u>paulcrocker71@gmail.com</u>) - as soon as possible.

Clubs MUST contact the League about their postponements before posting publicly on social media.

The League is unable to agree to postpone any fixture on unsubstantiated claims relating to player availability. Clubs failing to fulfil fixtures for any reason will be charged.

A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

A reminder that any views expressed in this newsletter are those of the contributors, not necessarily of the league.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

Changing Rooms

Please remember to show respect and to leave the changing rooms as you would like to find them after a match. We received several complaints already this season that rooms have been left dirty and even damaged.

Round-Up

Thanks to the storm and postponements last weekend, there was a very mixed bag of games this time out, in five different competitions!

Firstly, several **Hampshire Saturday Trophy** ties were rolled over from last Saturday. Senior Division leaders Colden Common had a good 4-2 home win at Oakwood Park over highly-rated Southampton Prem AFC Shirley — Archer scored two of Common's goals. There were two all-HPFL matchups, and they saw teams from the top half of the Senior Division all play each other. Both ended 1-1 and went to penalties. Hook beat Meon Milton in their shootout (Roxburgh scored Hook's goal in normal time) and Andover Town did the same at Liphook United. Division One Headley United also progressed by scoring nine at QK Southampton Res.

Our own domestic cup games were also scheduled for this weekend, but because of other cup rearrangments we only had three that were played.

In the **uhlsport League Cup** an interesting matchup between in-form Senior Division Harvest against Crofton Saints, going well in Division One, ended 1-1 and the visitors won on penalties. Southcott scored Harvest's goal in normal time, H.Clark scored for Crofton.

In the **George Mason Memorial Shield,** we had two local derbies. Liss Athletic, on a great run, came through 2-1 at home against Rushmoor Community, dangerous Division One opponents, who led at half time before goals by Anelay and a late one from Butler turned it around. The other game saw Overton United, fourth in Division One, host Stockbridge of the Senior Division, and again the home side won 2-1, Hannam and Elward on target for the winners.

We also had several league games:

In the **Senior Division**, Locks Heath failed to draw level with leaders Colden Common as they slipped up 1-4 at home to Hedge End Rangers, who had not been in great form recently. Caws got two of Rangers' goals. Bishops Waltham Dynamos, in a rich vein of form, also didn't take advantage of other teams' cup commitments and draw 1-1 at Denmead to remain in fifth. The bottom four all played each other - Moneyfields Res, third from last, beat the team just above them, Whitehill & Bordon, 3-2 - Brewer, Cutler and Kamara on target for Moneys, Judd and Coyne for Bordon - and bottom club Paulsgrove beat second-bottom Sway by the same score to move within a point of them.

In **Division One**, leaders Broughton finally lost their unbeaten league record in their fourteenth game, losing 2-3 to a second-half Cherry winner at sixth-placed AFC Netley, whose sixth unbeaten league game this was. Hedge End Town failed to go back into second as they could only draw 3-3 at the NormRod against third-bottom Mob Albion, for whom Sills got two. Lower down the table, QK Southampton got a good 2-2 draw at Whiteley Wanderers and move off the bottom again, as Twentyten conceded ten at fifth-placed Upham, whose first win in eight games this was. Hayling United are in a bit of form and got a good 2-2 draw at mid-table Silchester Village, but remain fourth-bottom.

Match Report

Silchester 2 Hayling United 2

A dry and sunny afternoon for a welcome change, and a well-presented pitch prepared by the hard-working Chair Paul Evans. I had a guided tour of the newly completed pavilion which is a credit to the club.

The game started in fairly dramatic style with a penalty awarded to Silchester after only 40 seconds, following a rugby tackle in the box - converted by Cook Little of note to report over the following 20 minutes, with exception of one shot well over the bar from Silchester. A succession of Silchester corners failed to increase the score. But on 40 minutes a quick break down the right from Hayling saw the resultant cross slotted home by Aldridge.

On 53 minutes, despite the linesman flagging for offside, and much protest from the Hayling side, Tennant increased Silchester's lead with a well taken goal. A brilliant one handed save by Johnston in the Hayling goal resulted in the ball dropping, and there were numerous last ditch goal line clearances by Hayling. What was looking like a victory for Silchester all changed on 94 minutes following a free kick awarded to Hayling was neatly headed in by Aldridge, so 2-2 it ended.
