A polite reminder...

...of various issues which have been brought to our attention which must be adhered to.

Pitch Surrounds

All pitches must have a barrier or a minimum of a stake and rope around all sides accessed by spectators. FA respect barriers are also suitable.

Spectators at 3G venues

Should not be permitted to stand pitchside except on the side(s) where there is hard standing for spectators to stand.

Technical Areas

Must be marked out or in the case of venues where they cannot be marked out (3G pitches for example) cones or discs you use for players warm ups to show the technical areas can be used.

Dug Outs

Are a requirement in the Senior Division. Seating a minimum of 8.

Small Sided Goals

Please ensure that any goals pitchside are moved well away from the pitch. In the case of 3G venues back into the enclaves built into the side of the pitch.

A note about jewellery

Clubs are asked to remind players that ALL jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed before entering the field of play.

Simply taping over the jewellery is not permitted and the referee will ask the player to leave the field of play and remove it thus becoming a player short until such time it has been removed.

Changing Rooms

Please remember to show respect and to leave the changing rooms as you would like to find them after a match. We received several complaints already this season that rooms have been left dirty and even damaged.

Round-Up

No problems with the weather, and we had several cup games, and plenty of important league games, with a lot of goals.

In the **Hampshire Saturday Trophy**, Whitehill & Bordon travelled to Ringwood Town Dev. and ended up losing on penalties after a 1-1 draw. Hook's trip to Tadley Calleva Res has been put back to this coming Wednesday.

In the **Hampshire Premier League Cup** quarter-final, we had a big match as the top two sides in Div 1 met at the NormRod, and, as in the league game two weeks ago, Broughton again came out on top 2-1 in a close game, Allen with the winner, to set up a cracking semi-final with Crofton Saints.

We also had the remaining **George Mason Memorial Shield** quarter final game with Senior Division Andover Town hosting QK Southampton, second-bottom of Div 1, and the home team won 10-0, with hat-tricks for both Morgan and Holmes.

In the **North Hants Intermediate Cup**, Silchester Village beat Twentyten 4-1 in an all-Div 1 clash in the first semi-final, and in the **Aldershot Intermediate Cup** Rushmoor Community had a good 4-1 win at Hartley Wintney Dev, two of their goals from Rowthorn.

In the **Senior Division**, we had top v bottom as Colden Common hosted Paulsgrove, and it finished 15-1, a record for Common, with Sunley and Lethbridge helping themselves to hat-tricks. Locks Heath lost 1-2 at home to mid-table Stockbridge, whose third consecutive win this was. Clark scored for Locks, Pye got both Robins' goals, but they finished with ten men. Bishops Waltham Dynamos overtook Locks into second after a 5-1 win at home to second-bottom Sway. There was the promise of a close game between seventh-placed Liss Athletic, with games in hand, and Hedge End Rangers, in fourth, with both teams on excellent runs, but on the day Liss came out on top 5-0 and are now just

behind Rangers in fifth. The damage was done in the first half, with braces for Austin and Mackay, and Rangers reduced to ten men. Meon Milton beat Harvest 2-0 at the Cockleshell, in what is now a local derby, to move above them into ninth. Mitchell scored both their goals.

In **Division 1**, with the top two in cup action, Overton United went second with a 2-0 win at Headley United, Martin and Elward the scorers. Fourth-placed Crofton Saints won 5-1 at fourth-bottom Whiteley Wanderers, two of these from sub Bowman late on. Ray's Farm saw sixth-placed Upham lost 2-5 at home to AFC Netley, in fifth, for whom Shirley got two to continue their good run. Hayling United also continued their good form with a 3-2 win at Mob Albion, Clark with a late winner there, and moved into seventh.

Match Report

Hedge End Town 1 Broughton 2

This quarter final of the HPL Challenge cup was between two teams who met in a very competitive match only 2 weeks ago, Broughton winning 2-1.

On a very cold, damp and dark afternoon the first 45 minutes reflected the weather. Apart from a couple of free kicks and four corners it was a pretty unremarkable first half although there was some quite good football .

0-0 at halftime

The game sparked into life in the 55th minute when Jack Barnes the Broughton captain and centre half went on a long unchallenged run down the right hand side and his cross was met by Brindley Williams who tucked the ball in for a one nil lead. A better few minutes from Hedge End Town followed but a quick break down the left hand side on the 62nd minute by Broughton found Ben Allen whose angled shot and unfortunately the ball was fumbled by the keeper to make it 2-0 to Broughton. Some chances for both teams in the following minutes with little to show for the efforts. Hedge End Town did get a consolation goal in the 89th minute when referee Mason awarded them a penalty for a clumsy challenge by Broughton. Chris Morey stepped up and converted the penalty . And at the finish it ended 2-1 to Broughton who go through to the semi final [Paul C].
