
Advent Study: A Child Is Born, by Amy-Jill Levine

Nothing screams more about It Takes a Village than the Church Conference. Did you know that everyone is invited to attend our Church Conference? And that all professing members get to vote for our church's leadership at our Church Conference.

Once a year every local church in the First United Methodist denomination meets with its district superintendent (DS) to hold its Church Conference- typically held sometime October through December. The DS presides over the meeting – our very own Rev. Dr. Brian Gilbert - who is the DS for our district, which is Prairie South District.

So, exactly what happens at a church conference, you may ask. Hymns are sung, updates from our district, our Northern Illinois Conference, and from the First United Methodist Church worldwide are given by the DS, updates on membership are given, and voting on leadership are some of the agenda items that take place during the meeting.

According to the Book of Discipline, "to encourage broader participation by members of the church, church conference [can be held] extending the vote to all professing members of the local church present at such meetings." (pg 181)

During the Church Conference, voting for the following positions may take place; chairperson of the church council, members of the committee on nominations, chair and members of SPRC (staff parish relations committee), finance committee, and trustees. Lay leaders may also be voted on during the meeting.

First UMC of DeKalb's Church Conference will be held this year on Saturday, November 8th at 10:30 am. All are welcome to attend and celebrate all the wonderful programs and missions that go on at FUMC, as well as all professing members are encouraged to come and vote for the church's leadership.

Church Conference booklets will be available to pick up after service on Sunday, November 2nd, please feel free to pick up a booklet before the meeting so that you can be well informed of all the goings-on at the church and names of those who will be recommended for leadership.

Stewardship Testimonial by Diane Anderson

My name is Diane Anderson and I have been a member of this congregation for almost my entire life. Quick side note, when I joined one of the Women's circles many years ago, they asked us to introduce ourselves. While I was doing this, Jane Hapeman spoke up and said, that's not right, and corrected my story. (I believe I had my dates wrong.) I tell you this because some of you know my story better than I do, but I will do my best.

My parents started bringing my sister and me to this church in 1976 after my grandfather had a heart attack. I have been an active member of this congregation for most of my life. I attended Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Methodist Youth Fellowship during high school, along with attending 3 different service projects before graduation. When I went away to college, I will admit, I did not attend as regularly as I should for a couple of years. After graduation came marriage and having kids. It was decided that it was important for our kids to be raised in the church, so I started back regularly, this was in 1999.

They were also baptized, confirmed and grew up here being active. I love this church, it is my home and this is my family. I know when times are tough and we have to deal with the things that life can throw at us, I can reach out and have an army of prayer behind me. There

will always be kind words of support, hugs, smiles. Anything needed to help through tough times. Those are just a few of the things I love about this church. It really is an extended family.

Since actively coming back I have served/volunteered in many different ways. I just started my 21st year of teaching Sunday School, and I was one of the preschool leaders at VBS out at Walcamp for 5 years. I was employed by the church for a short time as the bookkeeper, at which time I was a part of the finance committee. I also am an active member of the Foundation Committee and Board of Trustees. I am a volunteer counter for Sunday offering and currently serve as the chair of the Altar Guild, I honestly don't know how long I have been doing that but it has been many years.

Now since this is a stewardship testimony, we should talk about money. I have had many conversations with my dad about tithing. He hates talking about money in church and honestly, I don't believe he is alone in those thoughts. It seems to be a taboo subject at times, but it should not be. The church is run by money. If we don't have enough coming in, there can't be as much going out, simple as that. We all play an important part in that. I do believe we all think about finances differently, and that is ok, we are all different people with different financial means and backgrounds. Personally, I find it easiest to tithe weekly by giving automatically from my checking account. I

chose one day a week, Thursday for me, and my weekly giving is removed consistently, every week without fail. This can be managed through the website and is a very simple process. I prefer this method since it is just done. I don't have to remember my checkbook and getting my envelope in the plate during service since a lot of times I am off doing something. This process just makes it simple. I also enjoy giving to many of the different fundraisers throughout the year. I enjoy that I am able to give to the specific groups in addition to my weekly giving. This is basically the way I run my personal finances; I make sure the electric bill and the light bill are paid first, which would be my weekly giving going to general church expenses. Then we can do the "fun stuff" like buying pizzas, or quarts of lane's delicious spaghetti sauce to help missions or buying presents at Christmas for the angel tree. I feel this is very important, not only for the life of the church but to help keep the doors open and the lights on and to support the various missions, which feels like the heart of our church. We are a very giving congregation with our missions.
