
Alleluia! Christ is risen!

THE LESSON

Acts 10:34-43 God's Word, My Voice

Peter began to talk to Cornelius and the others: "I understand now that God doesn't see differences between people like we do. Everyone who believes in God and does what is right, no matter who they are or where they are from, is acceptable to God. The message sent to the people of Israel—that Jesus is Lord of all—has now spread throughout the world. The message began with God anointing Jesus with the Holy Spirit. Then Jesus went about doing good and healing people because God was with him. We all witnessed him doing that wherever he went. They killed him, but God raised him up on the third day. And after that we saw him alive, and even ate and drank with him. The risen Jesus told us it was our job to tell people what we had seen and heard, and to let people know that he was God's appointed one. Everyone who believes in him will be forgiven in his name.

THE GOSPEL John 20:1-18 CEB

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Early in the morning of the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. She ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they've put him." Peter and the other disciple left to go to the tomb. They were running together, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and was the first to arrive at the tomb. Bending down to take a look, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he didn't go in. Following him, Simon Peter entered the tomb and saw the linen cloths lying there. He also saw the face cloth that had been on Jesus' head. It

wasn't with the other clothes but was folded up in its own place. Then the other disciple, the one who arrived at the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. They didn't yet understand the scripture that Jesus must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to the place where they were staying. Mary stood outside near the tomb, crying. As she cried, she bent down to look into the tomb. She saw two angels dressed in white, seated where the body of Jesus had been, one at the head and one at the foot. The angels asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" She replied, "They have taken away my Lord, and I don't know where they've put him." As soon as she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she didn't know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she replied, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him and I will get him." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabbouni" (which means *Teacher*). Jesus said to her, "Don't hold on to me, for I haven't yet gone up to my Father. Go to my brothers and sisters and tell them, 'I'm going up to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene left and announced to the disciples, "I've seen the Lord." Then she told them what he said to her.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING


Leader: The Lord be with you. People: And also with you. Leader: Lift up your hearts.

We learned from Jesus to put you first, God, to love you and to listen for your Word to us. Jesus followed your word and went to the cross showing us that God's love could overcome even death, and bring new life. For all this we thank you and praise you, singing:

Leader: On the night before he died, Jesus sat at the table with his friends. He took the bread, thanked God for it, and gave it to them saying, "Take and eat. This is my body, given for you. Whenever you eat it, remember I am with you." Then he took the cup, thanked God for it, and gave it to them saying, "This is my blood. Whenever you drink it, remember I am with you." We now offer this bread, this wine, and ourselves, at this table in faith remembering that:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Leader: We ask that your Holy Spirit come to this table and fill this bread and this cup with God's powerful love that makes all things new. We pray that we, too, will be filled with the Holy Spirit and joined together as one people blessed and filled with hope. We pray this, giving honor and praise to God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. *AMEN*.

Leader: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Leader: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia. Leader: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

Everyone, regardless of age, is welcome to God's table to receive a blessing or communion!

Cross your arms over your chest for a blessing; extend your hands for the bread. When you receive the bread, you may either consume it and sip from the chalice, consume it and cross your arms over your chest to indicate you do not wish to receive wine, or hand the wafer to the Eucharistic Minister who will intinct it for you.

If you need a gluten-free wafer, please ask the person offering the bread.
