be all honor and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

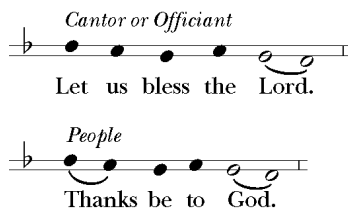
