Christ Child Ministry 2025

Remember, as a child, the excitement of making your Christmas list? And as a parent, the joy of giving your kids some of the presents they hoped for?

With the Christ Child Ministry, we aim to make this possible for families – supporting parents in providing Christmas gifts and Christmas dinner to their children. Families we support with this ministry include members of our local Boys & Girls Club (low-cost after-school care), clients from our Lazarus Financial Ministry and Food Pantry, and families in our Refugee Ministry.

Our model has evolved over the years, with a shift toward empowering parents to choose gifts for their children. A couple of years ago we surveyed our families and overwhelmingly they preferred going to the store themselves to pick out their Christmas gifts for their children. Which makes sense if you think about how unique each child is and the joy that comes with selecting gifts for your children. The likes, dislikes and passions of your own children are often only known by you. Many of you remember the ministry's pop-up Christmas store in the Auditorium at Christ Church, where parents could pick out toys for their child. The store was filled with toys bought by parishioners for children of all ages.

That's why today, families who register receive a \$125 Walmart gift card per child and \$75 Aldi gift card per family. Children also receive a stocking stuffed with gifts, a handmade hat or scarf and a fleece blanket. This year we have 96 families registered with 215 children.



The Christ Church Lazarus Ministry partners with ACT for Alexandria and NeighborShare

While the government shutdown has ended, the impact continues to affect many in Alexandria beyond federal employees. From contractors, cafeteria workers in government buildings to cleaning crews, security guards, childcare providers and landscapers, many continue to suffer from the shutdown

The Christ Church Lazarus Emergency Financial Ministry serves 14-16 people per week helping with rent, utilities and medical bills. We have seen firsthand the ripple effect the shutdown continues to have on Alexandria

residents. That is why we are so pleased to be part of a pilot of three Alexandria nonprofits working with ACT for Alexandria, our city's community foundation and NeighborShare to launch NeighborShare ALX. It was launched on November 1 and will run through the end of January. It is an online platform that provides financial support to individuals impacted by the shutdown.

The NeighborShare platform encourages everyone to donate from \$5 to \$400, literally neighbors helping neighbors. The Christ Church Lazarus Ministry is honored to be part of this pilot.

From ACT for Alexandria:

With one in three households already unable to cover a \$400 emergency, even a short pause in income can trigger crises like missed rent, empty fridges, and childcare gaps. NeighborShare ALX provides just-in-time financial assistance for small but pivotal expenses like car repairs, medical bills, or utility payments — preventing them from escalating into food insecurity, job loss, or even homelessness.

NeighborShare ALX has partnered with trusted local nonprofits that identify urgent household needs that would otherwise go unmet. Alexandrians can step in and directly fulfill those needs through this simple, secure, and community-driven platform.

Call for Lenten Meditations for 2026

Yes, you read that correctly. We are inviting you to contribute to our annual Christ Church compilation of daily meditations for Lent. It may seem premature to focus on Lent in Advent, much less the Christmas and Epiphany seasons; however, because Lent begins quite early in 2026, we will compile all contributions by January 16.

The times in which we live elicit a wide variety of emotions among us: fear, anger, grief, and depression but also compassion, gratitude, and hope. The Lenten journey covers the gamut of those emotions. Here are some suggestions.

- Meditate on the concept of forgiveness and letting go of grudges.
- Contemplate the importance of gratitude and recognizing blessings.
- Focus on the call to serve others and practice acts of kindness.
- Explore the themes of repentance and personal transformation.
- Reflect on the significance of sacrifice

and self-denial.

- Consider the ways God's redemptive grace has shaped your life.
- Engage with scripture passages that highlight Jesus' journey to the cross.

If there is a poem or work of art that has been impactful for your faith, your reflection may focus on that. Be sure to include the title and artist or author if you are referencing someone else's work.

Your thoughts can be shared in narrative or poetic style (no more than 300 words) and/or by an illustration. One

of us will be available to speak with you should you wish to discuss your thoughts and how you want to express them. When you have finalized your contribution, please email it to mgray@ccalex.org.


