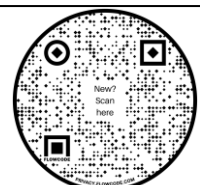

Sunday, April 26**

The Rev. Nathan Empsall is the Priest-in-Charge at the Episcopal Church of St. Paul and St. James in New Haven, CT, and the former Executive Director of Faithful America, the largest online community of grassroots Christians acting for social justice. His writing – particularly on Christian resistance to fascism and white Christian nationalism – has appeared in Time, Newsweek, NBC News, the Hill, the Daily Beast, Red Letter Christians, Religion News Service, and more.
