People Living in Recovery

Chaplain Shane Sims is the Executive Director of **People Living in Recovery**, a local nonprofit that assists families and individuals facing substance use, mental health and homelessness challenges.

Chaplain Sims is a nationally recognized recovery leader, trauma-informed practitioner, and community advocate whose work reflects the vision of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. for **a Beloved Community** grounded in justice, dignity, and redemptive love.

With more than a decade of leadership in *addiction recovery*, *reentry support*, and *nonprofit development*, Sims integrates lived experience, professional expertise, and faith-rooted service to advance healing and equity in justice-involved communities.

Chaplain Sims serves as Executive Director of **People Living in Recovery in Athens**, where he leads innovative peer-driven initiatives supporting individuals and families impacted by substance use, incarceration, and trauma.

His work has earned wide recognition and several commendations and awards, including the **Community Service Award** from the **Athens Area Human Relations Council**, nominations for the **Flame of Hope Award** from **Georgia's Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities**, and **Nonprofit of the Year** honors from the **Athens Area Community Foundation**. His **Principles Over Passions** mentorship model has also been featured in the **Atlanta Journal-Constitution** for its impact on recovery and reentry outcomes.

A certified Chaplain and sought-after speaker, Chaplain Shane approaches leadership as **both a sacred responsibility and a moral call to action**.

As **Keynote Speaker** for the **2026 Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Ecumenical Service**, he invites the community to honor Dr. King's legacy not only in remembrance, but through courageous faith, collective healing, and transformative justice.
