X. Essay & Criteria

The essay must be between 400 – 500 words, type-written, double-spaced in 12-point black Times New Roman font. It should also contain your original thoughts and ideas. Plagiarism will not be tolerated and will result in your application being automatically disqualified. You may type the essay in the space allotted at the end of the application or you may type it in a brand new document and submit it separately. (If you choose to submit the essay separately, you may put your name on an essay cover sheet but not on the essay pages themselves. The cover sheet will be removed prior to scoring).
