Would you like to pray with some saints of the Church-including the newly canonized St. Carlo Acutis? Have you always wanted a custom neck wallet and luggage tag?

If any of these fit your hopes and dreams, then I invite you to join me and my mom, Martha, on pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi, October 20-29, 2026. The trip is being led by St. Charles Pilgrimages. It is looking to be a spiritually fruitful pilgrimage AND an excellent, exquisite, enjoyable excursion.

My mom is a wonderful woman, and I know you will all love getting to know her. And I am sure my mom will enjoy telling stories about my younger years. Perhaps she will share the story about how she named me after a goose?

The Pilgrimage will have so many unique, special-access opportunities to encounter the saints and the glories of Rome. I'll mention a few. On our first day in Rome, we will have a private Scavi Tour of the cemetery under St. Peter's Basilica and the bones of St. Peter the first pope! One of the other days, we will visit the other three Major Basilicas of Rome and visit Santa Croce to see relics of our Lord's Passion. We are blessed to celebrate Masses in incredible places— St. Mary Major, Sunday Mass and a private Mass at St. Peter's Basilica, St. Mary of the Angels (Assisi), and the Basilica of St. Clare. We will get to spend time with and talk with some heavy-hitting saints–Francis, Clare, Agnes, Peter, Paul, John Paul II, and so many more! This is the pilgrimage to bring your prayer intentions as we will be encountering powerhouse intercessors.

We will be seeing Pope Leo at least twice. We will see him at the Sunday Angelus and the Wednesday Papal Audience. You may not get close enough to give him a hug, but you will receive his Apostolic Blessing-I think this might be better than a hug. We may even get to hear the Pope himself give the audience in English instead of hearing it through a translator!

I'm not sure exactly what an Umbrian dinner is, but we get four courses of it one evening! Delicious Italian wine will be flowing freely at many meals—including a visit to a winery.

Please join us-you won't regret it! It is looking to be full of spiritual graces and joy. We will encounter Christ in the churches, the Holy Father, saints, and one another. 
WORSHIP

Impact this Month

Reflect on your life and ask yourself:

What is the cost of discipleship for you?

Are you ready to live as a follower of our Lord?

Will you turn away from selfishness and make your daily decisions in light of Jesus' way of selfgiving love?

What does it cost to be a disciple of Jesus?

Christianity is not an organization that assesses dues once a year, like a fitness club that sends an email reminder when it is time to renew membership. And unlike joining a gym, making a commitment to live as a disciple is not about looking for the option that is the least expensive. The truth is, when we take the call of discipleship to heart, we realize that living as a follower of Jesus costs something. In fact, the more deeply we commit ourselves to our Lord, the greater the impact our faith will have. "It is costly because it requires a disciple for Jesus' sake to put aside the craving for domination, possession, and control, and grace because it confers true liberation and eternal life." (SDR, p. 15)

"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." -Luke 14:27

What is the cost of discipleship? Each of us responds to the Lord personally and discerns how we will respond to Christ's call to love and serve. There are common aspects of this way of life:

Disciples put God first, choosing God's and God's ways above all others. Disciples pray; make a commitment to follow Jesus and to grow in relationship with him; consider and respond to the needs of others, especially the poor and those in need of great care. Disciples go out of their way for the sake of others. Disciples sacrifice, because Jesus sacrificed himself for our salvation. Disciples turn away from the temptation to be self-centered and selfish, and instead give of themselves and their resources in order to make Christ's love known.

"Refracted through the prisms of countless individual vocations, this way of life embodies and expresses the one mission of Christ: to do God's will, to proclaim the Good News of salvation, to heal the afflicted, to care for one's sisters and brothers, to give life—life to the full—as Jesus did." (Stewardship: A Disciple's Response, p. 14)



Receive the cross of Christ:

On your forehead. Christ himself strengthens you with the sign of his love. Learn to know him and follow him.

- On your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord.
- On your eyes, that you may see the glory of God.
- On your lips, that you may respond to the word of God.
- On your chest, that Christ may dwell in your heart by faith.
- On your shoulders, that you may bear the gentle yoke of Christ.
- On your hands, that Christ may be known in the work which you do.
- On your feet, that you may walk in the way of Christ.



The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated on September 14, provides a reminder that throughout our lives, in every circumstance, we are to turn to the cross, and the love of Christ which the cross signifies.

On the cross, Jesus gave completely of himself. He held nothing back. And as a result, we have gained everything: salvation, mercy, forgiveness, love, and hope.

We are not to be passive recipients of these great gifts! The cross boldly beckons us to take up the life of




the steward which Jesus so completely models. Having been given much, we must give greatly in return, by sharing our faith, time, resources, and talents. At times, such giving will make us uncomfortable; we may risk rejection and we will be called to sacrifice. Jesus' undying love on the cross calls each of us to give without counting the cost, to find life by holding nothing back.

Each of us bears a different cross, and bears our crosses differently. For some, the cross is the burden of loss or illness, unemployment, disappointment, or loneliness. For others, the cross is the realization of God's great love for humanity, and the recognition of how we are called to love greatly in return. At times, we take up our cross willingly, but often, our crosses are thrust upon us.

We may find ourselves at a crossroads, called to choose how we will respond to the circumstances of this particular moment in time. We must take up our cross with God's grace, understanding that Jesus freely bore his cross, and walks with us as we strive to bear ours.

The cross also reminds us that the resurrection awaits those who willingly enter into Christ's passion and death as disciples and stewards. In dying to self, we rise with Christ to new life. In giving as good stewards, we share the life and light of Christ with the world.

MEAL TIME


Reflection on Luke 14:1, 7-14

More than any other Gospel writer, Luke portrays Jesus at meals. He eats not only with tax collectors and sinners, as in Matthew and Mark, but also with friends like Martha and Mary, and He dines frequently with Pharisees, as in today's story.

Luke, I believe, is doing three things with his emphasis on Jesus at meals. He is pointing to the centrality of the Eucharistic meal for us, where Jesus continues to instruct us and form us in our journey to the Father. He is teaching us that the Eucharist is a foretaste, a participation in, and a promise of an eternal banquet, where God is the host of a heavenly feast to which all are invited. And Luke is showing us that what we celebrate at Eucharist we must carry into our daily lives and allow to form and shape how we craft all our relationships.

Many of Jesus' most important and challenging teachings are given at these meals. Today, among other things, the virtue of humility is extolled. Humility does not mean beating one's breast and saying how awful one is, or not being allowed to admit one's worth and gifts. Rather, humility is the honest acceptance that all life is gift, and so the only proper attitude is to be grateful, rather than proud.

SAINT TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Saint of the Day: September 5

Luke 4:38-44

Patron Saint of World Youth Day and The Missionaries of Charity


Born to Albanian parents in what is now Skopje, Macedonia, Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhiu was the youngest of the three children who survived. During her years in public school, Agnes participated in a Catholic sodality and showed a strong interest in the foreign missions. At age 18, she entered the Loreto Sisters of Dublin. The following year she was sent to the Loreto novitiate in Darjeeling, India. There she chose the name Teresa and prepared for a life of service. She was assigned to a high school for girls in Calcutta, where she taught history and geography to the daughters of the wealthy. But she could not escape the realities around her – the poverty, the suffering, the overwhelming numbers of destitute people.

In 1946, while riding a train to Darjeeling to make a retreat, Sister Teresa heard what she later explained as "a call within a call. The message was clear. I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them."

She returned to Calcutta, where she lived in the slums and opened a school for poor children. Dressed in a white sari and sandals – the ordinary dress of an Indian woman – she soon began getting to know her neighbors – especially the poor and sick – and getting to know their needs through visits.

In 1952, the city of Calcutta gave Mother Teresa a former hostel, which became a home for the dying and the destitute. As the order expanded, services were also offered to orphans, abandoned children, alcoholics, the aging, and street people. For the next four decades, Mother Teresa worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor. She crisscrossed the globe pleading for support and inviting others to see the face of Jesus in the poorest of the poor. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. On September 5, 1997, God called her home. Blessed Teresa was canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016.
