THE GRACE TO GROW TOGETHER



I grew up in a smallish Catholic family (for the 70s) – only 6 kids. I'm the second, and the oldest four were all born within a five year window. I have one brother who's not even a year younger than myself, and while we shared a room for our entire childhood, sometimes we got along and sometimes we didn't. There was a time in our late teens when we truly hated

each other. There's really no other way to put it. We each had our reasons, but there was a lot of anger, bitterness, jealousy, and mistrust between us.

I'm not sure what exactly changed all that – perhaps time, distance, and a great deal more maturity – but during our young adulthood, our relationship began to thaw. And as we both married and began having children, we grew closer. My brother is now one of my favorite people in the world, a man I love and respect for his kindness, integrity, creativity, and knack for always seeing the good in others. I sometimes say, "When I grow up, I want to be like my younger brother." Don't get me wrong - we are still very different people, who disagree when it comes to things like politics and religion, but we don't let those differences come between us. We celebrate each other's successes, mourn each other's losses, and truly desire the good of the other.

My brother came to mind as I was thinking about Saints Peter and Paul, whom the Church celebrates this weekend. Although both were vital leaders in the early Church, it's clear from the Acts of the Apostles and Paul's Letter to the Galatians that Peter and Paul had some serious disagreements about the best way to live and share the faith. It got so bad that they had to part ways. Driven by a desire to evangelize the Gentiles, Paul left Jerusalem and traveled extensively; Peter remained in and around Jerusalem, his attention fixed on converting the Jews. They would rarely be in the same place again until they both died in Rome at the hands of the Emperor Nero a few months apart in about the year 65. Despite their disagreements, however, their deep love for the Lord united them. They truly did celebrate each other's successes, and mourn each other's losses. They understood deeply that their differences could actually work for the good of the faith if they each respected and celebrated the fact that there are as many ways to evangelize as there are people.

May we, too, have the spirit of Peter and Paul and their love for all people – the unchurched; those in our family and neighborhood who need to hear the Gospel; and those folks in the pews next to us who need a place to belong and be loved.







Reflection on Matthew 16:13-19

Forming community is a difficult task. Choosing to let others into our space, our lives, is a risky decision, in part because it means reaching out to people who are different from us: people who think and act differently, people less fortunate or more fortunate, people with different needs and perspectives.

Jesus chose these two odd fellows – Peter and Paul – not only to belong to His community of believers, but to lead it. And they are very different characters. Look at the symbols in Scripture presented here, which concretize how very different they remained: the symbol of the race for Paul, and of the rock for Peter. Paul is always on the move, making journey after journey to extend the faith to the known world. Peter was drawn to one place, Rome, which became the center-place, the home, the rock of Christianity.

Given the state of our world and our Church, it is good for us to reflect on the question of how we find unity in our differences. How does the Lord's choice of Peter and Paul help us see differences in another person in a positive, growth-oriented, and life-giving manner?

SAINT JUNIPERO SERRA

Saint of the Day: July 1

Patron Saint of California Missions

Born on Spain's island of Mallorca, Serra entered the Franciscan Order taking the name of Saint Francis' childlike companion, Brother Juniper. Until he was 35, he spent most of his time in the classroom – first as a student of theology and then as a professor. He also became famous for his preaching. Suddenly, he gave it all up and followed the yearning that had begun years before when he heard about the missionary work of Saint Francis Solano in South America.


Arriving by ship at Vera Cruz, Mexico, he and a companion walked the 250 miles to Mexico City. On the way, Junipero's left leg became infected by an insect bite and would remain a cross for the rest of his life. For 18 years, he worked in central Mexico and in the Baja Peninsula. He became president of the missions there.

José de Galvez persuaded Junipero to set out with him for present-day Monterey, California. The first mission founded after the 900-mile journey north was San Diego in 1769. Other missions followed: Monterey/Carmel (1770); San Antonio and San Gabriel (1771); San Luís Obispo (1772); San Francisco and San Juan Capistrano (1776); Santa Clara (1777); San Buenaventura (1782). Twelve more were founded after Serra's death.

Junipero made the long trip to Mexico City to settle great differences with the military commander. He arrived at the point of death. The outcome was substantially what Junipero sought: the famous "Regulation" protecting the Indians and the missions. It was the basis for the first significant legislation in California, a "Bill of Rights" for Native Americans.

He baptized over 6,000 people and confirmed 5,000. His travels would have circled the globe. He brought the Native Americans not only the gift of faith but also a decent standard of living. He is buried at Mission San Carlo Borromeo, Carmel, and was beatified in 1988. Pope Francis canonized him on September 23, 2015.


