

### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Couples should contact the Parish Office at least six months in advance of the marriage date.

### **INFANT BAPTISM**

Parents are required to attend a Baptism Preparation Class, preferably before the birth of their child, to have a child under the age of 7 baptized. 

### FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION

The next collection of items for the Ascension Neighbor-to-Neighbor Food Pantry will be held this weekend, December 20/21. The Pantry receives food from the Montgomery County Foodbank, from funds received from the Meijer Simply Give project, donations from several community organizations and individuals and of course, from the generous parishioners of the Mother of God Family of Parishes and Greenmont-Oak Park Community Church. The Pantry is always in need of nonperishable food items (cereal, canned meat, canned fruits and vegetables, soup, pasta, shelfstable milk, etc.) We do not receive personal care or household cleaning items from the Foodbank or Meijer. Thus, donations of bar soap, shampoo, deodorant, dishwashing liquid, laundry detergent, toilet paper, paper towels, etc. are also appreciated. You may drop off your donations in the large blue containers found at each entrance door at Ascension, or at the entrances of St. Charles and St. Albert for the pantries supported through those campuses. # A LIVING SIGN OF CHRISTMAS HOPE

As the Church draws closer to Christmas, Pope Leo XIV recently reflected on the deep meaning of the Nativity while welcoming participants in a "Living Nativity" tradition in Rome. Gathering pilgrims from around the world, the Holy Father reminded them that the Nativity scene is more than a cherished symbol—it is a living proclamation that we are never alone.

Celebrated near the Basilica of St. Mary Major, often called the "Bethlehem of the West," this tradition traces its roots back more than 800 years to Saint Francis of Assisi, who first brought the Christmas story to life for the faithful. Since then, Nativity scenes have helped generations encounter Christ through humility, simplicity, and wonder.

In reflecting on the scene of Jesus' birth, Pope Leo emphasized that God comes to us not with power or force, but in vulnerable love. The poverty of Bethlehem invites each of us to begin again—to follow Christ with hope, trust, and renewed faith. Like the Living Nativity participants processing through the streets of Rome, we too are called to be pilgrims of hope, bringing consolation and inspiration to everyone we meet.

At Christmas, the Nativity reminds us that we are part of a great story of salvation—a gift of light for a world still longing for hope.

Here at Mother of God Family of Parishes, we continue this living witness through our liturgical celebrations, our shared prayer, and the many ways we reach out to one another and our wider community. Each Mass, sacrament, ministry, and moment of welcome is an opportunity to make Christ present again through love, hospitality, and faith in action. Whether you're deeply involved or just beginning to rediscover your faith, you are invited to walk with us as we grow together as disciples, sharing the hope of Christ at Christmas, and all year round. As you gaze upon the Nativity this Christmas, where might Christ be inviting you to take one small step closer to Him? How might you carry His hope into your daily life in the days ahead?

### **END-OF-YEAR GIVING OPPORTUNITY: SUPPORT OUR SCHOOLS!**

The Ohio General Assembly has created an exceptional opportunity for charitable giving to benefit ALL Catholic schools in Ohio. Residents of Ohio can participate in a dollar-for-dollar INCOME TAX CREDIT for gifts made to a Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO).

# Why should I care about this?

Because you can make a gift that has immediate impact, and have your gift come back to you in the form of a tax credit on your Ohio income taxes. It is net-zero out of pocket for you, and a gift directly benefiting our schools in the Cincinnati Archdiocese.

# How does it work?

The state allows Ohio residents who make gifts to a Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) to earn a dollar-for-dollar income tax CREDIT up to \$750 individually (\$1,500 married filing jointly) Gifts to an SGO can be directed to the Catholic school of your choice ASCENSION, ST. ALBERT THE GREAT, OR ST. CHARLES BORROMEO!

# **How can I participate?**

- Verify that you have a 2025 Ohio income tax liability.
- Make a gift before you file your 2025 taxes or April 15, 2026 (whichever comes first) equal to your Ohio 2025 income tax liability, but not greater than \$750 per individual or \$1,500 married filing jointly.
- Make your gift to the Catholic Education Foundation Scholarship Granting Organization (CEF-SGO) and designate which school to receive your gift.
- A letter of thanks from the CEF-SGO will be mailed to you confirming your gift and designation. This letter is proof of your gift for filing 2025 Ohio income taxes.

### 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

On this last Sunday of Advent and a week before our Christmas celebration, we hear the announcement in Isaiah: "... the virgin shall be with child, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." Indeed a wondrous announcement, an astounding prophecy of a birth to take place 700 years after it was spoken.

But we know that this birth came about, in part, because two persons chosen by God took a risk of faith. In the Annunciation story, we encounter Mary's risk, her "let it be done to me according to your word." In today's Gospel, we hear about Joseph's dream, where he entertained an angel, and trusting in the words – "do not be afraid" – accepted the risk of faith.

Both Mary and Joseph are great models for us, for we, too, are called to take a risk of faith. Are we willing to center our lives on Christ and to risk the adventure, the challenge, and the true happiness of what this encounter entails? Will the coming of Emmanuel anew into our lives this year be good news for us?


## ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST


Saint of the Day: December 27 Patron Saint of Turkey

It is God who calls; human beings answer. The vocation of John and his brother James is stated very simply in the Gospels, along with that of Peter and his brother Andrew: Jesus called them; they followed. The absoluteness of their response is indicated by the account. James and John "were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him" (Matthew 4:21b-22).

For the three former fishermen – Peter, James and John – that faith was to be rewarded by a special friendship with Jesus. They alone were privileged to be present at the Transfiguration, the raising of the daughter of Jairus and the agony in Gethsemane. But John's friendship was even more special. Tradition assigns to him the Fourth Gospel, although most modern Scripture scholars think it unlikely that the apostle and the evangelist are the same person.


John's own Gospel refers to him as "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (see John 13:23; 19:26; 20:2), the one who reclined next to Jesus at the Last Supper, and the one to whom Jesus gave the exquisite honor of caring for his mother, as John stood beneath the cross. "Woman, behold your son.... Behold, your mother" (John 19:26b, 27b).
