# WHAT I LEARNED FROM EXODUS90, ST. MICHAEL'S LENT

Deacon Chris Jasek

Beginning Friday, August 15, MGFP will begin St. Michael's Lent. It is a 45-day spiritual exercise for men from Exodus90. It begins August 15 (Solemnity of the Assumption) and ends September 29 (Feast of Saint Michael and the Archangels).

I've done this program in the past. I was motivated to try it because I was tired of the bad habits in my life and I longed to break free for my spouse and family. I also wanted to build fraternity with other men of faith. Rather than dealing with "things" on my own, I knew I needed more community and wisdom from brothers in Christ in my life.

Some of the disciplines of this program looked very challenging to me - getting up to pray on Fridays at 2 a.m., fasting and taking a cold shower twice a week, and giving up social media. It was going to be tough, but I knew I needed this! Here is what I learned through this exercise:

- The importance of daily prayer and reflection it made my life so much deeper and more meaningful.
- The strength, wisdom, and brotherhood that comes from being in fraternity with other Christian men. No man is an island.
- That I can do hard things (e.g., giving up social media for 45 days) and feel a sense of victory in them.
- How important fasting and rest is to a fulfilled life. Times of sacrifice and work need to be balanced with times of celebration.

Brothers in Christ, I invite you to join me, Fr. Tony, Joe Ollier,

and other MGFP men August 15 as we begin St. Michael's Lent. It is going to be a challenge, but we'll grow in fraternity with each other and be better men in the end. Let's go!

St. Michael's Lent involves following certain disciplines each day or week. Some of the key disciplines are: a weekly 60-minute meeting with your fraternity of men from MGFP, daily prayer and reflection, and weekly fasting. #### Our Father, Who Art in Heaven...

In reflecting upon this week's readings, I realized how often I take The Lord's Prayer for granted. Being a prayer that I recite daily, I often find myself zoning out and not focusing on what I am truly saying. By giving us The Lord's Prayer, Jesus gave us a type of template for how to pray and talk to God. It's like an "all-purpose" prayer, so to speak. While Luke's Gospel provides a slightly amended Lord's Prayer, we all know the words we were taught to pray:

"Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

Let's look at this prayer line by line. Our Father – The love God has for us is the all-encompassing and unconditional love of a father. We are all His sons and daughters (hence the word "our") and come to Him with childlike trust. Who art in heaven – According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, heaven "does not mean a place, but a way of being; it does not mean that God is distant but majestic." Hallowed be thy name - To be hallowed is defined as "regarded as holy; venerated; sacred." We are acknowledging God's greatness. Thy kingdom come – Not only are we asking God to fulfill His promise, but that we may be able to spread God's kingdom on earth through our love of God and others. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven – With these words, we are acknowledging that God's will is always better than our own will. Just because we ask for something doesn't mean we will receive it. Give us this day our daily bread - We are not only asking God for our daily bread, but we are trusting Him to provide for all our daily needs. We also recognize that the Father gives us Jesus in the Eucharist as our ultimate nourishment. Jesus is the daily bread that we need to feed us, to fill us, and to lead us to eternal life. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us - We ask God to forgive us for our sins, and by accepting and understanding His grace, we to learn how to forgive others. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil – Here we ask God to guide us toward His will and away from sin's temptation.

I challenge you this week to not just mindlessly rattle off The Lord's Prayer, but pray it attentively and from our hearts. Through this prayer, may we be reminded that God, our Father, is always there for us. I leave you will a few words from the hymn, Seek Ye First, by Karen Lafferty:

"Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added unto you; Alleluia. Ask, and it shall be given unto you, seek, and you shall find, knock, and the door shall be opened unto you; Alleluia."







#### ASK. SEEK. KNOCK.

Reflection on Luke 11:1-13

Ask, seek and knock, and you will receive, find, and the door will be opened to you. We have this promise directly from Jesus. We also have it directly from Jesus that if we ask God for a fish, we won't get a snake, and if we ask for an egg, we won't get a scorpion. We can go to God for the fish and egg special and be assured that we will not get something unfriendly, inedible, or poisonous instead.

One key to understanding prayer is the simple truth that what we want and what we need are two separate realities. God can see the difference, if we cannot. Prayer is going to the God who has promised to work all things to the good for those that love Him, not in any attempt to manipulate God or to change God's will, but in a sincere desire to learn God's will for us. We pray so that we might be changed.

We have all heard the warning, "Be careful what you ask for...." This is a good instruction for approaching the Lord's Prayer, because we are really asking, seeking, knocking – in these words Jesus taught us – to be changed, by our Father's Holy Name, into doers of His will.

#### **SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA**

Saint of the Day: July 31 Patron Saint of Retreats

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Ignatius whiled away the time reading about the life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began.


It was during this year of conversion that Ignatius began to write down material that later became his greatest work, the Spiritual Exercises.

Ignatius spent the next 11 years in various European universities, studying with great difficulty, beginning almost as a child. Like many others, his orthodoxy was questioned; Ignatius was twice jailed for brief periods.

In 1534, at the age of 43, he and six others vowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. If this became impossible, they vowed to offer themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The latter became the only choice. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general.

Ignatius remained in Rome, consolidating the new venture, but still finding time to found homes for orphans, catechumens, and penitents. He founded the Roman College, intended to be the model of all other colleges of the Society.

Ignatius was a true mystic. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity – the Trinity, Christ, the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, Ad majorem Dei gloriam – "for the greater glory of God." In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of his men. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls.
