# MOMS WHO LUNCH: CASUAL CONNECTION, CATHOLIC COMMUNITY



Sometimes all it takes is a lunch break to build something beautiful.

Moms Who Lunch is a new ministry launching this summer (July 24) at the Mother of God Family of Parishes. Founded by Ashleigh Bakos, a mom of one. a recent Catholic convert, and a parishioner at St. Charles Borromeo, this group is designed for moms in all seasons of life—from those trying to conceive to grandmothers with grown children—to come together, relax, and find friendship over a shared meal.

Ashleigh, who moved to Dayton a few years ago to join her husband Weston in his hometown, knows firsthand how hard it can be to build community in the busyness of motherhood. "As a full-time working mom, I always found it hard to join the traditional Mom-to-Mom groups, Bible studies, or weekday gatherings. Most things happened during the day or afternoon, when I was either working or juggling family obligations—and I started

to feel like I was missing out on getting to know other moms in our parish," she says. "I didn't want to start something that felt like another commitment. I just wanted to take something I'm already doing—eating lunch—and turn it into something meaningful."

And that's exactly what Moms Who Lunch is.

This ministry is simple by design. There's no prep, no pressure—just a casual meetup at a local restaurant, where moms can come as they are, kids in tow if they'd like. The goal is to offer each other a bit of connection and encouragement as we each strive to live liturgically, love our families well, and make space for faith in our everyday lives.

Ashleigh, who joined the Catholic Church last year and had Bence baptized in October at St. Charles, describes her journey to faith as one led by love and guided by God's providence. "It was really God that brought us here," she shares. Now, Ashleigh volunteers

in the parish nursery and is excited to give back through this welcoming ministry.

All moms are welcome: new moms, expecting moms, spiritual moms, grandmas, and emptynesters. Whether you're deeply involved in parish life or haven't been to Mass in a while, this is a space to belong.

#### It Is in Giving That We Receive

In this week's Gospel reading from St. Luke, there are a few statements made about neighbors. To paraphrase:

- · After loving God with our "all," we should love our neighbors as ourselves.
- We need to be clear on who exactly our neighbor is so we can love them specifically.
- · A neighbor is one who treats another with mercy

Recently, I had a "neighbor experience" I'd like to share with you. My wife and I were camping in Michigan for a week while we attended some spiritual direction training. After a few days in our campsite, we noticed our neighbor in the campsite next to us was a single woman living out of her minivan. She rarely left her car and had no camping equipment, and we assumed she might be homeless and in need. While I was praying one morning, the Lord

was nudging me that I was campsite neighbors with this woman for a reason. God put the two of us here together at the same time and that was no coincidence. I felt God was asking me to do something for her.

The next day we bought a gas card for her and in the evening we walked over and gave it to her along with some soup and a prayer card. She was surprised and graciously received our gifts. I thought we were going to just drop these things off and that would be it, but God seemed to have other plans. From speaking with her, we found out that she was an active Catholic, prayed regularly, and was in Michigan to receive ongoing medical treatments. We prayed for her healing and she promised to pray for us. We told her about the Catholic parish we were attending and invited her to check it out. We exchanged experiences about healing and various treatments which I'm sure God has a plan for in the future.

St. Francis is known for saying, "It is in giving that we receive." That was certainly true in this case, for I received much more from this encounter than I expected. It seems whenever we step out of our comfort zone and take a risk to do what God is calling us to do – it is always very good and blessed!

Now, what new neighbor in your life is God asking you to reach out to with love and mercy? Do not be afraid. Go and do so expecting God to do more than you can ask for or imagine!

#### **NEIGHBOR**

Reflection on Luke 10:25-37

"And who is my neighbor?" Such a simple, seemingly innocent question. And yet it elicits the most familiar and loved story; a story that we have been so taken by that we have named hospitals and laws after "the good Samaritan."

In two of Jesus' greatest stories – the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son – the motivation of the main characters is compassion. The father sees his son from a distance and moved by compassion runs to welcome him. The Samaritan sees the man in the ditch and moved by compassion stops to bind his wounds and bring him to safety. Without this moment of compassion, the father remains on the hill and the Samaritan goes about his business.

The kind of love of neighbor and capacity for compassion called for in the Gospel requires cultivation, an open heart, and overcoming of the preoccupation with ourselves and our instinctive withdrawal from pain, suffering and inconvenience. For a person stripped, beaten, lying halfdead in a ditch is a gross inconvenience. Unless you love him. The only times we will find our neighbor are when we are loving and generous enough to become one.

#### **SAINT BONAVENTURE**


Saint of the Day: July 15 Patron Saint of bowel disorders

Born in Bagnoregio in 1221, Saint Bonaventure was baptized John, but received the name Bonaventure when he became a Franciscan at the age of 22. Little is known about his childhood, but we do know that his parents were Giovanni di Fidanza and Maria Ritell. It seems that his father was a physician and a man of means. While Saint Francis died about five years after the saint's birth, he is credited with healing Bonaventure as a boy of a serious illness.

Saint Bonaventure's teaching career came to a halt when the Friars elected him to serve as their General Minister. His 17 years of service were not easy as the Order was embroiled in conflicts over the interpretation of poverty. Some friars even ended up in heresy saying that Saint Francis and his community were inaugurating the era of the Holy Spirit which was to replace Jesus, the Church, and Scripture. But because he was a man of prayer and a good administrator, Saint Bonaventure managed to structure the Order through effective legislation. But more importantly, he offered the Friars an organized spirituality based on the vision and insights of Saint Francis. Always a Franciscan at heart and a mystical writer, Bonaventure managed to unite the pastoral, practical aspects of life with the doctrines of the Church. Thus, there is a noticeable warmth to his teachings and writings that make him very appealing.

Shortly before he ended his service as General Minister, Pope Gregory X created him a Cardinal and appointed him bishop of Albano. But a little over a year later, while participating in the Second Council of Lyon, Saint Bonaventure died suddenly on July 15, 1274. There is a theory that he was poisoned.

Saint Bonaventure left behind a structured and renewed Franciscan Order and a body of work all of which glorifies his major love – Jesus.
