Our August sermon series, Dear Gentle Church, explores what it means to be a community that doesn't just exist, but rather grows, transforms, and becomes even more inclusive, kind, and faithful. The Modern lessons this month are letters to the church written in the style of an advice columnist. Hear these words:

Dear gentle Church,

You've gotten really good at the word "welcome." It's on your banners, your website, your bulletins, your lips. And I believe you mean it. I really do.

But here's the thing: saying "you are welcome here" is only the first step. What people are really asking is, "Will I be seen here?" "Will I be safe here?" "Will I belong when I bring my whole self—not just the Sunday morning version of me?"

Church, radical hospitality isn't about politeness or smiles at the door. It's about rearranging the furniture—sometimes literally—to make space for people you haven't met yet. It's about learning a new song so someone else feels at home. It's about asking, "Whose voice hasn't been heard?" and meaning it.

You don't have to be perfect. But you do have to be open. Not just to people's presence, but to their story, their perspective, their leadership. Because "welcome" without belonging is just a mat—something people wipe their feet on before moving on. Let's do better than that.

Incense Use in Worship At Cathedral of Hope, incense is used as part of our worship experience on select holy days, including Christmas Eve (11pm), Epiphany Sunday (10am), Good Friday, Easter Sunday (10am), Pentecost (10am), and All Saints Sunday (10am).

We use a hypoallergenic incense designed to minimize irritation, but we recognize that sensitivities vary from person to person. If you have concerns, we invite you to speak with an usher or clergy member so we can support your worship experience in a way that feels safe and comfortable.

First Time Guests •

If you are joining us for the first time, stop by the Connect Center to meet and greet with volunteers and staff, and to pick up a special gift from us to you.
