Bird Nerd & The Red List is an exciting dance theatre piece, focusing on popular UK birds of high conservation concern.

Take a journey with the birdwatcher as they embody four different birds; Lark, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Swift and Nightingale. A fascinating exploration through dance, music, sound and spoken word. Performed and created by dance artist and performer, Marie-Louise Flexen.

While exploring habits and behaviour, we see the birdwatcher's personal and emotional connection to each bird and the natural world.

Followed by a crafting activity session.


Each child will have the chance to design,

PRIMARY SCHOOL WORKSHOP

The Bird Watchers and The Birds

An immersive movement and music session for children, in response to UK birds. Children taking part will swoop into the natural life of birds, as they explore how birdwatchers observe them and the fascinating ways in which birds move.

Children will be able to experience the joy of movement and music as they discover more about the behaviours and habitats of UK birds such as the Lark, Nightingale, Swift and Woodpecker.

The workshops are especially suitable for Primary school children and children with Special Educational Needs.

We can deliver to a group of key stage 1 or key stage 2 children, with up to 20 in a group.

The workshops can run for up to an hour.

CARE HOMES AND COMMUNITY HOSPITAL WORKSHOPS All Things Birds!

An inclusive and therapeutic movement and music session, in which participants will have a full sensory experience, as they journey into the natural life of birds.

Those who take part will be invited to enjoy moving to music and reminisce about their own memories of birds. To touch and explore the movement of feathers, or perhaps hold a bird nest. To become the birdwatchers, as Marie-Lou dances among them. To play with rhythm and listen to the natural sounds of birdsong.



The workshops are for adults with a learning and/or physical disability and older people in care and hospital ward settings. The sessions are inclusive and can meet the needs of all the participants.

The sessions can be run during a morning or afternoon.

Time will include setting up, participant movement, music, some movement from Marie-Lou, time to talk about birds and the all-important tea break!

She has worked with renowned dance makers and theatre directors since graduating from the London School of Contemporary Dance. Over the past 20 years she has produced, created, and directed numerous Arts Council funded and commissioned performances, which have included large-scale site-specific works, touring dance theatre, dance films, combined arts collaborations, outdoors arts, street theatre, participatory dance, cabaret and performance for influential musicians. Previously Marie-Louise was a company member of Seven Sisters Group, London and El Paller, Catalunya. After moving to Gloucestershire, she also became a dancer with rhythm tap company Sole Rebel and Swerve Dance Theatre. Marie-Louise won 2015 Inspiring Leader, One Dance UK award. She was a finalist in The Place Prize 2005 and was nominated for a Total Theatre Award 2007.
