



Tell your parent or loved one that you want to ensure their final arrangements are done according to their wishes and you need help to make that happen.

Ease into the conversation, "What type of funeral would you like to have?" may open up the discussion to more details of your loved ones wishes.

After attending a funeral or visitation, talk to your family and ask them if those type of services was something they would like.

Funeral Arrangements

Whether you're planning for yourself or a loved one, the funeral service is one of the most important elements of a person's final wishes. Regardless of the type of service selected, a funeral service can allow a time to celebrate the life of the deceased, allow family and friends to say their last goodbyes, provide closure and allow friends to console the family by giving their final respects.

So, what is a funeral? A funeral is a gathering of family and friends after a death of a loved one that allows them the opportunity to mourn, support each other and pay tribute. Mulhane Home for Funerals is dedicated to personalize each service and no matter what type of service is selected, it will be an opportunity for your loved ones to say goodbye and start the healing process.

Funeral Service Options

A formal or informal ceremony or ritual can be selected for yourself or loved one. Although faith dictate some of the elements of the funeral, all services can be customized to you and your family's preferences.

Funeral services can be held in a place of faith, the funeral home or even graveside at the cemetery of burial. If cremation is selected, these services can also be held before or after the cremation process. Services held before cremation can have you or your loved one available for a viewing for loved ones to say goodbye or services can held after cremation with the urn available for any services selected.

When burial in a cemetery is considered, a traditional burial can be selected with a casket or the option of burying the urn after cremation can also be selected.

Visitation or viewings can be held the night before or immediately prior to the funeral services. The visitation provides a way for friends and acquaintances to pay their respects and offer condolences to your family. These types of services are also important for your family to have closure, say goodbye and begin the grieving process. It can be a celebration of a person's life and honor a life that has touched family, friends and community.

There's no one, right way to plan a funeral service. We believe that each funeral should be as unique and memorable as the life it honors.

When planning your own funeral service in advance, think about the way you want to be remembered and how your loved ones want to be celebrated and remember you.



What To Do First

When a death occurs there are so many things to consider and decisions to make. These lists and suggestions can help you navigate through them.

When a death occurs:

At Home: If the deceased is on hospice care, notify the hospice nurse. The hospice nurse or family can contact the funeral home. If the deceased is not under hospice care, you should call 911 to being the process with the local or state police.

At a Hospital: You can notify the hospital of your selection of funeral home but as a family you should always contact the funeral home directly. Even if the hospital says they will notify the funeral home, family should contact the funeral home themselves to help the release process start as soon as possible.

At a Nursing Home or Long Term Care Facility: Notify the staff which funeral home you have selected and tell the staff to contact that funeral home directly to make transfer arrangements.

Items to secure at a time of death:

After contacting the funeral home for an appointment to make further arrangements, you should begin to discuss your loved one's wishes and gather the following items. Some will be needed at the time of arrangements.

- Vital Statistic Information: This sheet can be provided by the funeral home or it can also be filled out in this bereavement guide.
- Military Discharge papers or the DD214 form
- Will if funeral decisions are specified by the deceased in a legally recognized Will
- Insurance Policies
- Photo of person for obituary and tribute card
- Clothes (if ready at the time of arrangements or can be gathered later)
- Cemetery Information
- Whether your loved one wanted to a traditional burial or cremation
- Service details (would you like a visitation, viewing and type of services)
- Clergy or church that will perform the ritual services selected.
- Begin to discuss family or friend pallbearers, music, photos and flowers that may be used during services selected.

To My Family and Friends

I wished to spare you as much anxiety, doubt and confusion as possible at the time of my death, so in this booklet I have suggested some arrangements in advanced. This booklet includes vital statistics, funeral service guidelines and cemetery requests, which are all important to share with the funeral director while assisting you to plan my service. The booklet also includes more personal material for eulogies, obituaries and other remembrance as well as advice and guidance on other important issues you may come across. Please accept these arrangements in the spirit they are given: with love, hoping to give you comfort and help you to remember the times we shared.
