This year, the show will be nationally televised several times on the Lokar Car Show on MotorTrend TV and other networks.

Much success is owed to the large volunteer effort, with volunteers from this year's benefiting charities and volunteers from the AHEPA Chapter and committee helping with check-in, set up, vendors and hospitality.
