

"Our focus is on preparing students not just for college, but for careers as well. Over 85% of our students move on to college, but we're also seeing a growing interest in career-focused paths, such as Wilson Tech," he explained. It's exciting to witness students pursuing hands-on careers in fields like HVAC, cosmetology, and, soon, fire science!

A key success for the guidance department has been the expansion of its resources. Mr. Citrano oversees a team of 9 dedicated and vibrant counselors who are able to give personalized attention to each student. This individualized support has contributed to a graduation rate consistently over 98%. Mr. Citrano also praised the department's efforts in fostering a welcoming environment for all students, making the guidance office "one of the most welcoming places in the building."

The guidance team uses tools like Naviance to help students explore their career interests and develop strong study habits. The success stories speak for themselves: from students going to Ivy League schools to those attending community colleges like Suffolk, all have been well-prepared for their next steps, thanks to the dedicated work of the guidance department.

Looking ahead, Mr. Citrano's vision for the program includes continued growth, particularly in the realm of career education. "I'm excited to see the expansion of tech-focused programs. The future is bright, and I'm confident the guidance team will carry on the legacy we've built here," he shared.

As he nears retirement, Mr. Citrano leaves behind an impressive legacy of guidance and leadership. His passion for education, his team's hard work, and the growth of the guidance department at Half Hollow Hills East will undoubtedly continue to impact students for years to come.

Navigating care can be overwhelming, but the team at WellLife Network's Youth Care Coordination simplifies the process, offering care for children and adults with Medicaid across Suffolk County, NY.

Comprehensive Care for All Ages

WellLife serves children (age 5+) and adults indefinitely, connecting families to mental health, physical health, or substance abuse services. Their mobile model brings care directly to homes or community settings.

Easy Access, No Waitlists

Getting started is simple—a quick referral and call to Amber is all it takes! Once Medicaid eligibility is confirmed, families are quickly connected to a case manager. Best of all, no waitlist!

Tailored Mental Health & Substance Abuse Support

WellLife offers in-home therapy, family therapy, and skill-building services for kids and teens. Their Family Support Advocacy Program guides families through the system. Substance abuse support starts at age 16, offering counseling and medication management.

Addressing Housing Instability

WellLife partners with local shelters, linking families to housing resources, Section 8 applications, and food pantry services. Parents are referred to WellLife's adult program for further housing assistance.

Support for Developmental Disabilities

WellLife helps families with co-occurring conditions like autism and anxiety, assisting with OPWDD applications until families are connected to specialized case managers.

Collaborating with Schools

WellLife works alongside school counselors to advocate for students and help families navigate school processes. Regular communication ensures comprehensive support.

Bilingual Services Available

With Spanish-speaking staff and a partnership with Lodestar Children's Services for bilingual therapy, WellLife ensures families get the care they need in their preferred language.
