



### Who Are the Dominicans?

The Order of Preachers (Dominicans) were founded in 1216 by St. Dominic de Guzman for the primary purpose of defending the truths of the Catholic Faith through a life of prayer, study and holy preaching. Realizing the destructive nature of sin and the theological errors of his time, St. Dominic made the study of sacred truth (*Veritas*) as one of the pillars of his order.

In 1285 a rule was composed for lay people, men and women, single and married, who wanted to live a life based on the spirit of St. Dominic. Today Lay Dominicans continue to bring the truth of the Gospel to their families, parishes, workplaces and social gatherings. Lay Dominicans strive to live a life of holiness by living within the elements of Dominican life based on Prayer, Study, Community and Apostolate, the four pillars of Dominican Spirituality.

# Jesus teaches us not to be greedy

In today's Gospel reading, a man tells Jesus that his brother is being unfair to him. But Jesus knows that the man is just being greedy, so He tells him the

parable of the rich farmer. One year he had such a good harvest that he couldn't fit it all into his barns. He tore down his old barns and built new ones, so that he could store his food for many years. But just when he thought he would be able to rest and enjoy his food, God told him that he would die.

This parable is a warning against being greedy. Jesus is not saying that we should not save some food or that we shouldn't save our money. He is just telling us to remember that we are going to die one day, and then everything we saved is going to be useless for us. He wants us to use the things we have wisely, but not be too attached to them.

Think of something that is really special to you. How would you feel if you lost it or it was taken away? Do your feelings show that you care too much about things? Try to think of your belongings in such a way that if you lost them you wouldn't be too upset. After all, none of your stuff is going to matter to you when you die!




# Saint Dominic August 8




