Pope Saint Callistus I October 14

















WHEN THE POPE DIED, CALLISTUS WAS CHOSEN AS THE NEW ONE. HE WAS KILLED AS A MARTYR IN 223 AD, PROBABLY IN A RIOT SINCE THERE WAS NO PERSECUTION AT THE TIME.
