Introduction

Section 5: Reset Plan

Practical Reset Plan

1. Document every core tool, process dependency, spreadsheet, and manual handoff.

3. Find repeated entry points, redundant reports, and workaround tasks.
4. Start where pain is visible and business impact is high.
5. Design processes around clean handoffs, automation, accountability, and reporting.
6. Define how future systems are evaluated, approved, and integrated.
7. Measure time saved, friction removed, visibility gained, and decision speed improved.
