


GOSPEL MEDITATION THE MOST HOLY TRINTY

I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways. For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to his Apostles, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now" (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before his resurrection and ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So he does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as he teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what he is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in him and his Apostles), he never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: he knows what you are ready to learn

Paul encouraged believers that


in Jesus we have peace with God and through the Holy Spirit we have the love of God in our hearts. Why do you think these fruits of the Holy Trinity have been given to us?

Corpus Christi Procession

The Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi invites all the faithful of Santa Fe to join a city-wide display of devotion to the Blessed Sacrament on the Feast of Corpus Christi on Sunday, June 22, by participating in a procession from the Cathedral Basilica around the block downtown. The Celebration begins with Mass at 11:00 a.m., followed by Ado-




ration of the Blessed Sacrament from 12:30 - 1:30 p.m.; the procession will begin at 1:45 p.m. All parishes are asked to walk in the procession with their banner and especially invite their Eucharistic Ministers, Adoration Societies, First Holy Communicants and other youth to be in this procession of the Blessed Sacrament.

Novena in Honor of Our Lady of Peace

The annual novena in honor of Santa Fe's patroness, *Nuestra Señora de la Paz*, begins with the First Novena Mass on Sunday, June 29th, at 11:00 a.m., followed by the Coronation of the Santa Fe Fiesta Royalty, and the procession from the Cathedral Basilica to Rosario Chapel at approximately 1:00 p.m. Please note that Sunday's Mass, celebrated by Archbishop Wester, is the first Mass of the Novena. The return procession is the following week, Sunday, July 6th, **following the 6:00 a.m. Mass**, departing from *Rosario* Chapel to the Cathedral Basilica, at approximately 7:00 a.m. We will have an *encuentro* at the Stations of the Cross Prayer Garden with refreshments to follow. All parishes are asked to attend the Mass and walk with their banner and parishioners.

All the faithful are encouraged to make the Novena Masses (9) from June 29^{th} – July 7^{th} . Masses will be held at 6:00 a.m. at Rosario Chapel Monday – Saturday (June 10^{th} – June 16^{th}). There will also be two (2) evening Masses at 5:15 p.m. on Tuesday, July 1 and Thursday, July 3^{rd} .

The first Novena Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica on Sunday, June 29th, at 11:00 a.m., and the closing Novena Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica on Monday morning, July 7th, at 6:00 a.m.
