



GOSPEL MEDITATION SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

What do you call brothers who are born on the same day? Twins, of course. That is what we celebrate today in the inestimable saints, Peter and Paul. Wait: twins? Yes. The early Church believed that Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome on the same day. Since the day of martyrdom is celebrated as a



saints' birth into eternal life, the result is striking: Peter and Paul are twins in God's family, the Church.

Who should care about this? Well, anyone who longs to live in a world marked by love and peace. Remember, the Romans believed that twins, Romulus and Remus, founded their city through an act of fratricide, the former murdering the latter. Sadly, the structures of this fallen world emerge through violence between those who should love each other. But in the Church, a new city has been founded upon this new set of twins, embodying the non-violent power of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

That's why traditional icons represent Peter and Paul in a fraternal and warm embrace. Contrasted with the violence of Rome's founders, it challenges us with a bold claim: do we believe that structures of merciful love are more powerful and lasting than those based on power, violence, and domination? Am I willing to see others in my life as my "twin," with whom I am called to give my life for Christ, or as my rival? Am I committed to living what is embodied in Romulus and Remus, or in Peter and Paul?



Sunday, July 13 at St. Pius X School (in the Fine Arts Building), there will be an "Interfaith Remembrance of the Trinity Test: 80 Years and Still Waiting." Doors open at 2 p.m., and the event begins at 2:30 p.m. Registration is encouraged: jotform.com/form/251126623369053

Topics at the event will include the status of nuclear weapons programs in New Mexico, the harmful effects of uranium mining, the human and environmental impacts of nuclear testing, the growing national Back from the Brink movement, how young people are engaging with these issues, the role of hope and faith as we face growing nuclear threats, and what we can do now.

Wednesday, July 16, at 6 p.m., a special Mass will be celebrated at St. Francis de Paula Catholic Church in Tularosa (704 St. Francis Dr., Tularosa, NM 88352) to mark the 80th anniversary of the Trinity Test - the first detonation of an atomic bomb, which signaled the start of the nuclear age. Following the Mass, there will be a dinner and reception in the parish hall, concluding with a candlelight vigil at the Veteran's Memorial Park.

Reflect and Respond to Scripture

First Reading:

Gospel:

Jesus commissioned Peter to be the foundation ("rock") of his Church. Are there any roles or responsibilities you feel called to do in your parish?

Novena in Honor of Our Lady of Peace

The annual novena in honor of Santa Fe's patroness, *Nuestra Señora de la Paz*, begins with the First Novena Mass on Sunday, June 29th, at 11:00 a.m., followed by the Coronation of the Santa Fe Fiesta Royalty, and the procession from the Cathedral Basilica to Rosario Chapel at approximately 1:00 p.m. Please note that Sunday's Mass, celebrated by Archbishop Wester, is the first Mass of the Novena. The return procession is the following week, Sunday, July 6th, **following the 6:00 a.m. Mass**,



departing from *Rosario* Chapel to the Cathedral Basilica, at approximately 7:00 a.m. We will have an *encuentro* at the Stations of the Cross Prayer Garden with refreshments to follow. All parishes are asked to attend the Mass and walk with their banner and parishioners.

All the faithful are encouraged to make the Novena Masses (9) from June 29th – July 7th. Masses will be held at 6:00 a.m. at Rosario Chapel Monday – Saturday (June 10th – June 16th). There will also be two (2) evening Masses at 5:15 p.m. on Tuesday, July 1 and Thursday, July 3rd.
