CONTINUUM OF CARE COMPETITION

FY26 COC COMPETITION REALLOCATION NOTICE

The Coalition for the Homeless of Houston/Harris County, as Collaborative Applicant for The Way Home Continuum of Care, is sharing this notice about reallocation funding for the FY26 CoC Program Competition.

Reallocation means that funding from an existing CoC project may be made available for a different eligible project through the local competition process.

For FY26, the estimated reallocation amounts are:

- **Non-YHDP Reallocation Amount: \$5,643,753**
- **YHDP-Restricted Reallocation Amount: \$118,814**

The YHDP-restricted amount may only be used for eligible youth-dedicated/YHDP projects. It is separate from the general reallocation amount.

The non-YHDP reallocation amount is expected to be used, as funds are available, for eligible local priority projects that were previously submitted through the FY24/FY25 local NOFO process and continue to align with FY26 HUD priorities and local system needs.

IMPORTANT NOTES

This notice does not mean any project has been approved, ranked, or awarded funding.

All projects must still:

- Submit required FY26 local application materials;
- Meet HUD eligibility requirements; Meet local threshold requirements;
- Align with FY26 HUD and local priorities;
- Complete local review;
- Be ranked through the local competition process; and
- Receive final approval from HUD.

The total amount requested by local priority projects may be higher than the reallocation amount available. This means projects may be reviewed, reduced, ranked, or adjusted before the final CoC Priority Listing is submitted to HUD.

Reallocation-funded projects are expected to be placed in Tier 2 as part of the FY26 local competition strategy. If a project does not meet eligibility, threshold, budget, or local competition requirements, the CoC may redirect the funding consistent with HUD requirements, local competition policies, procurement standards, and Steering Committee priorities.

No project is guaranteed funding because it was previously submitted or identified as a priority project. Final decisions will depend on project eligibility, application review, ranking, available funding, tiering, and HUD approval.
