

Celebrating Catholic Schools Week

During Catholic Schools Week, we celebrate the ministry of Catholic education, and at Holy Family Catholic Schools, that ministry comes to life through the steadfast support of our parishes and broader faith community.

Across our system, a renewed culture of faith is taking root, led by students who are choosing prayer, worship and Christian community.

What began as a small student Bible study at Wahlert Catholic High School has grown to nearly 80 students gathering weekly for prayer, Scripture and fellowship, even welcoming teens from other local schools. These gatherings reflect an environment where students feel encouraged to deepen their faith and grow in relationship with Christ.

Inspired by what they see at the high school level, younger students are stepping forward as leaders. Students at Mazzuchelli recently launched a Bible study that is already drawing strong participation.

This movement is rooted in Christian witness – students and staff living their faith openly, supported by parish partnerships that strengthen sacramental life, retreats and faith formation. Parish clergy, volunteers and parishioners help bring faith beyond the classroom and into daily student life.

Faith is visible throughout our campuses – students filling the chapel for Friday morning Mass, praying before performances and closing dances with worship. Serva Fidem small groups continue to bring students together through shared prayer, service and accountability. In classrooms, teachers connect academics to a Christian worldview.

Record retreat participation, growing servant-leadership and student-led initiatives all point to the same truth: faith is alive, flourishing and nurtured by a community united in mission.

We thank our parish communities for the commitments you make to our schools each year. You make our ministry a reality, and we are truly grateful.
