# History of Conservation in Florida Speaker Ann Paul

Protecting birds and other wildlife carries over into providing significant benefits to humans, too. Much of the early conservation of the natural history of the United States started here in Florida, and that initiative continues today.

Seasons are changing. The ring-necked ducks and lesser scaup are long gone from our waters. and so are the yellow-rumped warblers from our woods. March is a transition month, with winter visitors leaving and just the beginnings of spring migration. There is still a gray catbird or two left, and a few palm warblers, but they too will soon be heading north to raise families.

This morning, on our West Campus Nature Trails, I was greeted by a beautiful swallow-tailed kite overhead, and a great crested flycatcher on the wire; both are March arrivals. Migration begins in earnest in April.

Mrs. great horned owl is no longer alone in the nest at La Jolla Ave and N Pebble Beach Blvd; I saw an extra pair of "ears" next to her. We can watch her youngster (or youngsters) grow up in the coming weeks.

### TRAL BLAZING

A jumping plant louse on the Sun City Center Nature Trails can somersault in midair twenty times faster than an Olympic gymnast! For example, Simone Biles when executing her epic triple-double rotated at approximately two rotations per second while the SCC jumper executes an initial rate of 39 per second, making it the fastest forward-rotating species on the planet! How do we know? Dr. Adrian Smith at North Carolina State filmed them at 14,000 frames per second, slowed the film down, counted and did the math. Our jumper is the Red Bay Psyllid, *Trioza magnoliae*, that spends its entire youth as a wax-coated larva in a leaf gall as shown above. The distinctive galls are easy to spot and since jumping plant lice are species-specific, the galls are an easy way of identifying Red Bay trees. The galls cause only cosmetic damage, doing no lasting harm to the plant. Red Bays though do succumb to laurel wilt disease, caused by a fungus farmed by a tiny ambrosia beetle. But that is a topic for another column.

The larvae are easy to find, just slice open a gall. Come join Sun City Audubon on Earth Day, April 22 between 10 and 11 at the trailhead and I will show you how it is done. Guided trail walks and other fun and educational activities are planned as well. What a great way to celebrate Earth Day!

The Nature Trails is an ongoing project of the SCC Audubon Club in cooperation with the SCC CA. The trailhead is located opposite North Lake on Del Webb West between Vincennes and Seton Hall.
