News from our Master Birder Ray Webb

We are nearing the beginning of spring migration. Early April marks the arrival of orioles, tanagers, buntings, grosbeaks and other birds that nest throughout the contiguous 48 states. March, however, has its spring arrivals as well.

Last week I saw a beautiful golden-yellow warbler called a prothonotary warbler at Lettuce Lake Park. This species will nest there.

I also have seen a few swallow-tailed kites, large, graceful birds which feed on dragonflies and the like. Here, on our West Campus Nature Trail, I found a redeyed video. This bird nests here in Florida and throughout the U.S.

Some of our winter residents will soon be leaving us. On our trail I heard a blue-headed vireo (formerly called solitary vireo) in full song. They are here through winter but are silent. This bird is getting his hormones in order and will soon be raising a family north of here.







Crested Caracaras in the Spotlight at April Meeting

Central Florida's prairies are home to the Crested Caracara, a large, boldly patterned raptor that feeds on carrion as well as live prey. At our last meeting of the season, on Saturday, April 2, Adam Kent will give a presentation on this impressive bird. Adam has been studying this species for the past several years and will offer detailed insights based on his observations.

Some interesting facts about the Caracara:

- It's a member of the falcon family
- It has a naked face that turns color from redorange to pale yellow under stress
- The bird runs and walks more easily than other raptors due to flatter talons
- Sadly, it is a threatened species, primarily due to habitat loss

Another bird -- an Anhinga – sparked Adam's passion when he was about five years old. Since then, he has worked on many different environmental and education projects, including as a naturalist guide. His biologist positions have involved assessing sites for the Great Florida Birding Trail and working as Florida's first Scrub-Jay Conservation Coordinator. He is a past President of the Florida Ornithological Society and is very involved with the state's second breeding bird atlas. One of Adam's birding highlights was making recordings that led to the description of a new species in Mexico, the Nava's Wren.

The meeting will be held in the Florida Room beginning at 9:15 a.m. with socializing and refreshments. Attendees are asked to bring their own coffee mug. The business meeting will start at 10 a.m., followed by Adam's presentation.

Update on our proposed avian pole:

TECO has agreed to donate a telephone pole and a platform which is to be installed at the entrance to our nature trail in June or July. This pole, which substitutes for the power pole that Ospreys formerly nested on, will be installed by a company called PowerTown.

The cost of installation is approximately \$755.00 to be paid for by the club through private donations. About half the funds have been raised so far. We will be raffling off some plants donated by our sponsors on Earth Day to help pay for the pole.
