TECO Manatee Viewing Center Speaker: Stan Kroh Meeting February 7, 2026

TECO's Environmental Manager, Stan Kroh, will give a presentation about the company's Apollo Beach Manatee Viewing Center at the Sun City Center Audubon Club's monthly meeting Saturday morning, February 7th. His lecture will include information about the Florida "Sea Cows" and their annual winter journey to the clean, warmer waters that are discharged from Tampa Electric's Big Bend Power Plant in Apollo Beach.

Kroh will also discuss a little bit about the history of the Manatees and TECO's efforts over the years, to provide the marine mammals with a safe and comfortable environment during the winter months, when the coastal waters in the Tampa Bay area are significantly colder.

He will also talk about TECO's Manatee Viewing Center, that includes raised boardwalks to better observe the aggregation of these usually solitary animals. The center also has a gift shop, a snack bar and educational information and displays.



Manatees generally migrate to areas of the state between November and April, where the water temperatures are a more consistent 72 degrees. These sites generally include easily accessible freshwater springs and waterways, as well as coastal waters near power plants in Florida. The rest of the state's waterways become significantly colder in winter, when the temperatures hover between the low to high 60's. That's much too cold for the warm-blooded animals. That's the reason they prefer to gather near Power Plants, that discharge warm water into the nearby bays and intracoastal waterways.

Kroh has been TECO'S Manager of Land and Stewardship Programs for the company for the past 16 years. He also chairs the Hillsborough Greenways Committee and serves as President of the Hillsborough River Watershed Alliance. He's a Registered Environmental Manager and a Certified Waste Management Professional.

Kroh will give his presentation in the Florida Room of the Atrium Building about 10:30, after club business and announcements.

Coffee, Tea and pastries will be available for club members and their guests, from 9:15am until 10:00am. Please bring your own cups and beverage mugs.

Felts Preserve - Palmetto, FL

We exchanged with the other group at the bird blind, where we heard a red-shouldered hawk and saw indigo and painted buntings, grackles, doves, and of course, squirrels.

The other group had an adventurous time on an overgrown trail and identified 11 different birds! Felts Preserve is lovely, with an easily accessible bird blind, bluebird houses, beehives, a garden of native plants, and a nice pavilion. After the walk, most of us went to Popi's by Port Manatee and had a nice lunch, while a few of us ended up at the Popi's in downtown Palmetto. All of the locations have great food and service. It was an enjoyable day for all.

The Conservation Committee is looking for volunteers to assist in monthly wading bird surveys from March through July. These surveys are for Florida Audubon Colony Watch and take place at Middle Lake and North Lake Islands and at a small site in Kings Point.

Most importantly, we need one or more individuals living on Middle Lake and North Lake who are willing to volunteer their time AND boats to circle the islands to count nests. Additional volunteers are needed to count and identify birds in nests and record bird species data.

There will be a Zoom training meeting in early March followed by in person training on March 24th. Training is hosted by Audubon Florida.
