Your Health and well-being are our top priorities. We are committed to providing compassionate, high-quality nursing care in a welcoming, patient-centered environment. Our experienced nurses offer a wide range of healthcare services.

The Greenbriar at Whittingham Health Care Center is staffed with one nurse and is open 7am – 11pm, 365 days per year.

Health Care Center Services

The following services are available to residents:

- Response to home and community emergencies; dial 9-1-1 for all emergencies. The Health Care Center and local first aid squad are both notified.
- Basic First aid.
- Assessment of illness in the Health Care Center.
- Collection of diagnostic specimens, including blood draw and urinalysis. Bring your prescription to the Health Care Center and make an appointment with the nurse.
- Wound dressing changes. Bring prescription to the Health Care Center and schedule an appointment with the nurse.
- Medication injections can be administered by the nurse at the Health Care Center with a physician's order (after receiving two injections at the physician's office). Contact the Health Care Center nurse for further instructions.
- Blood pressure and blood sugar screenings.
- Influenza (Flu shot) vaccination clinics.

- Communication with the resident's healthcare professionals and family regarding changes in the resident's health status.
- Health education in response to the resident's healthcare needs (e.g., self administration of insulin injections).
- Telephone triage.
- Resident and family services referral.
- Annual health/wellness fair.
- Health education programs provided by Saint Peter's University Hospital professionals and community partners are hosted regularly throughout the year.
