JSP reforestation efforts hit a milestone in 2025! Thanks to our partnership with **KSU Forestry & Natural Resources program**, the native tree saplings planted across JSP in 2018 through **Reforest Frankfort** are mature and healthy enough to survive on their own.

Together, these efforts ensure the park remains a living landscape of art and ecology.
